THE GAY WAY ?

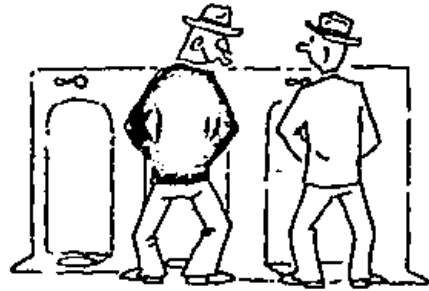
In the October 15th issue of Forbes Magazine there was an interesting article which should reinforce our view of the strength of the Gay Community on a national scale. The 65 year old firm of Horn & Hardart, of automat fame, are considering opening a chain of Gay clubs. In conjunction with Blueboy magazine they have planned their first Gay Club, opening the first part of the year, in Miami. If this succeeds they plan a dozen or more to follow. Horn & Hardart's 1975 sales amounted to \$50 million, so if the test is successful there is no doubt that more will follow. It is just a sign of the times.

We still take the position that we should patronize Gay owned establishments, but we fully realize that there are many fine eating, drinking, clothing, etcetra establishments that are owned by the Straight community, and while they do not cater specifically to the Gay, they none-the-less are excellent establishments and deserve our support - if they support us.
