All proceeds from each ticket sold will be turned over to the Trust which is dedicated to the physical and mental health of Arizona AIDS patients and also acts as an educational group publishing literature etc.

## 'Demand Your Rights' County Attorney Candidate Mach Urges Tucson Gays

TUCSON - William Mach, Republican candidate for Pima County Attorney, urged Lesbians and Gays to overcome discrimination by becoming a political and legal force. Mr. Mach addressed 30 Lesbians and Gays at a Political Forum sponsored by the Tucson Lesbian and Gay Pride Committee on October 5 at the Temple of Music and Art. "You can become such a force in the community, but, to do it, you must demand your rights," Mach said.

TLGPC had invited all county office seekers to speak at the Forum. Mr. Mach was the only candidate to attend. His opponent, County Attorney Stephen D. Neely had agreed to attend but did not appear. The following day, Mr. Neely said he scheduled another appointment for that evening. His understanding was that he had to meet with TLGPC before he could attend, and no one called his campaign office to set that up. Clearly Mr. Mach nor any of the other candidates invited by TLGPC had that misunderstanding.

At the Forum, Mr. Mach spoke to the group for over an hour. He said that the law "should have no interest whatsoever in what consenting adults do among themselves. I support the repeal of laws governing acts by consenting adults."

Mr. Mach also stated that he would support and actively enforce a county Lesbian and Gay rights ordinance banning discrimination based on sexual or affectional preference in housing, employment and public accommodations.

When asked about the public uproar over the disappearance of Vicki Hoskinson and the slaying of Michael

Perry, and the concern of Lesbians and Gays in the category of child molesters, Mach said, "it would be absurd to label Lesbians and Gays as child molesters."

Jack Stockslager, chairperson of TLGPC also addressed the meeting. He stated that Lesbians and Gays historically and realistically function in the heterosexual society from a base of the fear of being found out. "We fear losing our jobs, being arrested, losing housing and rejection by family and friends. This fear prevents many of us from reporting crimes committed against us," Stockslager explained. "We are not asking for special consideration, but to be treated equally," he continued. He stressed that, "one way to help eliminate this fear is public communication. This Forum is a step in that direction by publicly asking politicians to address the issues that affect our lives."

Mr. Stockslager reported that the candidates for county supervisor had been contacted by telephone after many of them did not respond to two letters of invitation. Iris Dewhirst did respond to the invitation, and although she had a prior commitment agreed to an interview before the Forum so her positions could be known. See separate story this issue.

Supervisor David Yetman said he would not attend the Forum as he was running unopposed and his presence would serve no purpose. Reg Morrison and Eva Bacal had full calendars. Ed Moore was driving a bus for a soccer

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## Latest Falwell Mailing Makes Harsh Attack Yet

I do believe my second-favorite journalist (second to Murray Kempton) is Myra MacPheerson of The Washington Post. Her coverage of this election year has been astonishingly good. In a new series, she has found just the right tone of coverage for the pious lubricity of Jerry Falwell.

Back in the 1950's, Falwell defended segregation by claiming integration was just a plot hatched in Moscow. In the 1980's, he opposes the Democratic Party because it is just the stalking horse for homosexuals. He opposes a plan not for its internal flaws, but for its unworthy sponsors.

How does he know this? Because his son infiltrated the ranks of the enemy in San Francisco. How did he do that? By walking down the streets. In Falwell's words, "He went incognito into the streets." The description of what happens on the streets of San Francisco makes it seem that no one would remain incognito without traveling in drag.

Why did Falwell subject his 17-year-old son to this experience? Because the boy is a photographer, and Falwell wants to send his followers, in sealed envelopes, pictures of homosexuals seen in flagrante. These are inclosed in his missive "in a sealed envelope to protect children from such sights." What about his own child? The old sin-sniffer knows how to ginger up a sermon, all right.

In the 1950's, the plotters were more discreet. Integrators did not kiss pictures of Stalin on the streets in the South. But only Stalin has a motive to eliminate segregation in America. According to Falwell: "The true Negro does not want integration. He realizes his potential is far better among his own race. Who then is propagating this terrible thing? First of all, we see the hand of Moscow in the background?..."

Falwell's doctrine of "the true Negro" is an interesting one. What is a false Negro? Someone pretending to be black? Maybe a KGB agent in burnt cork. The absurdity of American politics can only be grasped when we remember that the president and the vice president of the United States are honored, at the other convential, by this lurid ecclesiastical clown. ## San Francisco Shuts Down 14 Gay Spots To Fight AIDS

TWO of the photos included in Jerry Falwell's latest mail campaign come with a warning that the reader destroy the photos so that no children see them.

The simple and accurate word for this is McCarthyism. The McCarthyites saw communist plots everywhere, even within President Eisenhower's executive staff. At the Democratic National Convention this year, Falwell saw homosexual conspiracy everywhere. This is not simply a campaign to secure Gay rights, but to bring about "a different America." To rape our children.

"Militant homosexuals plan to force every major American corporation to set official policies giving them favored job status...to pass laws forcing churches and Christian schools to hire homosexual and Lesbians even if they flaunt their lifestyle...and they do have their eyes on our children!"

SAN FRANCISCO, CA (AP) - The city's public health director ordered 14 Gay bath houses and sex clubs to close immediately, accusing them of "fostering disease and death" by allowing indiscriminate sexual contacts that can spread AIDS.

"These businesses have been inspected on a number of occasions and demonstrate a blatant disregard for the health of their patrons and of the community," Dr. Mervyn Silverman said at a news conference.

He said the 14 establishments including the 21st Street Baths, Boot Camp, Animals, Club Baths of San Francisco, Jack's Turkish Bath and Jaguar Adult Bookstore, were among 30 investigated by undercover health officials since an April ordinance went into effect banning "unsafe" sexual

**COUNTY CANDIDATE DEWHIRST SUPPORTS NON-DISCRIMINATION COUNTY ORDINANCE**

TUCSON - Although prior commitments prevented her from attending the Political Forum sponsored by the Tucson Lesbian and Gay Pride Committee, County Supervisor candidate Iris Dewhirst agreed to an interview before the Forum took place so her positions could be made known at the Forum.

Generally, Ms. Dewhirst would support and vote for a county Lesbian and Gay ordinance against discrimination. She does not believe that Lesbian and Gays are prone to molest children.

She is in favor of the ERA and feels the doors should remain open regarding abortion. She would appoint minorities to her staff including qualified Lesbians and Gays.

The Political Forum was taped by "Arizona Gay", Tucson's Gay weekly television show, and will be shown on Cox Cable public access station.

**AIDS TRANSMISSION BY SALIVA UNLIKELY**

WASHINGTON, DC (AP) - The virus believed to cause AIDS has been found in the saliva of people with the greatest risk of getting the deadly disease, but federal health authorities said it is unlikely that anyone could get AIDS through contact with saliva.

Research at New England Deaconess Hospital in Boston and the National Cancer Institute in Bethesda, Md., confirm a previous suspicion that AIDS might be transmitted through saliva, as well as through other bodily fluids.

Shellie Lengle, a spokeswoman for the U.S. Public Health Service said no one was surprised about finding HTLV-3 in saliva. She said concern is minimized because all evidence indicates that saliva is not an efficient method of transmitting AIDS.

A virus like this might be transmitted if uninfected persons had cuts or sores in their mouths at the time of contact, she added, or if they were nicked using the razor of an infected person.

Cross-infection seems unlikely from casual contact, or handling dishes and utensils used for meals, she said.

**CUOMO CALLS FOR N.Y. STATE GAY RIGHTS BILL**

ALBANY, NY (GCH) - New York Governor Mario Cuomo appointed a state Task Force on Gay issues, created by his Executive Order 28 which bars discrimination on the basis of sexual orientation in the provision of state services and in state employment. Cuomo, at a press conference, also called for a state law to bar discrimination against Lesbians and Gay men.

"This executive Order represents a failure, it's a failure of government that I have to issue an Executive Order to protect Lesbian and Gay men from discrimination. Non-discrimination should be a matter of public policy," Cuomo declared.

**NOW GIRLS**

SAN FRANCISCO, CA (GCH) - Michael Jackson, whose screaming protestations that he is as straight as straight comes have made big news, has gone on the offensive of late, according to the "Bay Area Reporter". The San Francisco Gay paper reports that Jackson's mouthpiece, Norman Winters, suggested that comedienne Joan Rivers "Look into her own closet".

Apparently, Rivers has recently made reference in her comic routines to the Jackson preference question: "Michael Jackson is Gay. He's Gay. Her lost his other glove in Boy George's pocket."

The intrepid BAR reporter dutifully relayed Winters' dykebaiting remark to Rivers' mouthpiece Richard Grant. Said Grant, "I will not dignify that question with a comment."

**LONGSTAFF DEPORTATION DELAYED**

WASHINGTON, DC (GCH) - A legislative maneuver by the House Judiciary Subcommittee on Immigration, Refugees and International Law has, for the time being, protected a Gay man threatened with deportation, according to the Washington Blade. The subcommittee voted recently to send a request "for more information" to the Immigration and Naturalization Service which has been trying to deport Richard Longstaff of Texas. The move, taken during work on a private bill introduced by Mickey Leland (D-TX) to prevent Longstaff's deportation, effectively stymies any INS action against Longstaff until the committee receives the report.

Leland introduced the bill after the Supreme Court refused to hear Longstaff's appeal of an unfavorable ruling by the Fifth Circuit Court of Appeals which said Longstaff had not been lawfully admitted to the country when he did not identify himself as a "psychopathic personality," the INS code words for homosexual.

**WHEN INSIGHT FAILS**

What follows are AIDS precautions as handed down to the followers of Rajneesh:

"1. One doesn't repress sex drive, but simply give it up through insight. That is the most certain protection against AIDS.

"2. Whoever is not enlightened enough for that must stay with one partner, melt together with him innerly more and more until sex becomes unimportant.

"3. When, however, it has to be, then: use condoms during the sex act and latex or rubber gloves during foreplay. Totally avoid anal and oral intercourse."

The Seattle Gay News reports that shortly after these guidelines were released to the Rajneesh rank and file, a Berlin ashram requested from the London Rubber Company a "differential bid for your prophylactic brand Wenn purchased in lots of three, five and ten thousand."

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activity at sex parlors and bath houses. The 14 have not complied with the ordinance, said Silverman, who has been under pressure from Mayor Dianne Feinstein to order the shutdowns.

"The places that I have ordered closed have continued in the face of this epidemic to provide an environment that encourages and facilitates the multiple unsafe sexual contacts, which are an important factor in the spread of this deadly disease," Silverman said.

"Make no mistake about it. These 14 establishments are not fostering Gay liberation," Silverman said. "They are fostering disease and death."

Most of the victims of acquired immune deficiency syndrome are homosexual men. The disease destroys the body's ability to fight disease, leaving it prey to cancer, pneumonia and other infections.

Authorities posted closing notices on the sex club buildings. If a notice is ignored, the city would go to a judge to obtain a court order shutting down the operation, officials said.

Silverman's announcement came just a week after the department released figures showing an increase in the reported AIDS cases in San Francisco, where officials estimate that 15 percent of the city's 700,000 population is homosexual.

In September, 39 new cases of AIDS were reported for a total of 723 since July 1981. Eighteen AIDS patients died in September the department said. According to the federal Centers for Disease Control in Atlanta, 6,122 AIDS cases have been reported throughout the United States and 2,734 of those patients died.

ONE CHIEF TOO MANY

COLUMBUS, OH (GCM) - When Gay and Lesbian activists here confronted the local police chief about queerbaiting by his officers, he responded by appointing a liaison between the department and the Gay/Lesbian community, according to the Ohio State University "Lantern". But if the liaison and the rest of the boys in blue reflect the chief's attitudes, Columbus Gay folk may be in no better shape than before.

Chief Dwight Joseph told about 75 people at a recent meeting that Gay people who complain of police harassment are paranoid. Last May, a meeting between Joseph and Stonewall Union president Rhonda Rivera was prompted by a series of anti-Gay incidents, including police taunting Gays outside bars and arrests for jaywalking and drunk driving. Joseph however, admonished the town queers, saying, "We have police officers that are opposed to your lifestyles and that's their right. I can't change attitudes. Just maybe some of you are being a little paranoid about why you're being stopped."

One audience member countered, "Columbus cops are swarming all over Gay bars, but you never see them at any of the other bars. If you're going to enforce the laws, enforce them equally."

Joseph was asked if the department has an anti-Gay hiring policy. "Not that I'm aware of," he replied.

"Shouldn't you know?" he was asked.

"I can't know everything," Joseph wisely answered.

When asked what he would do if there were an openly Gay officer on the force, Joseph replied, "I've thought long and hard about that - I really don't know."

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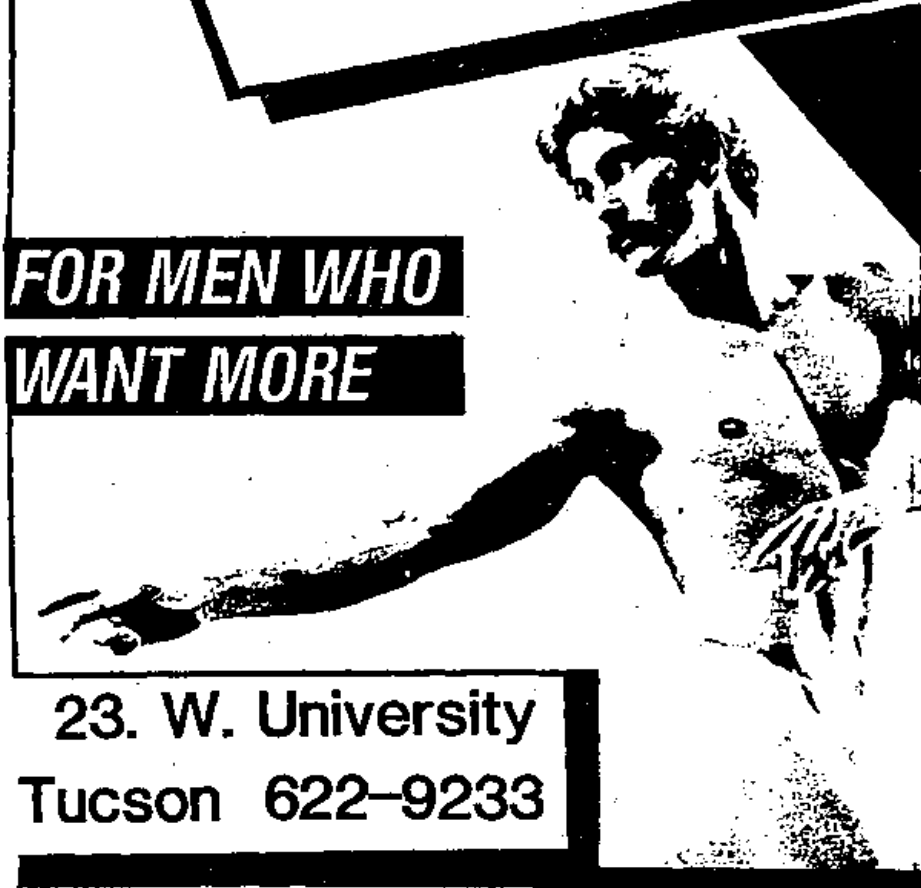
team that evening. Jim Howell's office promised an interview at a later date.

## Gay Teens Ask For An Open Door

High school can be a pretty scary place. The straight-A student who actually likes science and carried three ballpoint pens in his shirt pocket is labeled a "nerd". The kid who's going through puberty later than everyone else is the "retard", always the last to be chosen when teams are picked in gym class.

But what about the teenager who's Gay, and who realizes it? Or, worse yet, who's Gay - and everyone knows it? It happens, and it can make high school traumatic, especially when there's nowhere to turn for help.

When he was 15 and a high school freshman, J.R. was a solid athlete. But instead of being popular, J.R.'s teammates called him "the queen bee" of the track team." By his own description, J.R. is rather effeminate. During his two years at Madison's West High School, he usually hung around with girls instead of boys.

J.R., now 18 and employed in Madison, says that ever since he was in junior high, most of his peers have assumed he was Gay. He has never tried to persuade them otherwise. "I can't think back that far!" is J.R.'s response when asked when he first realized he was homosexual.

Like J.R., Paul has known of his sexual preference most of his life. Now 17, Paul is a senior at West High. But unlike J.R., he says no one at school suspects he is Gay; in fact, he went through a period when he deliberately tried to prove he was straight, both to himself and to his friends.

Recalling his early adolescence, Paul says his wet dreams and fantasies while masturbating were always about men, sometimes a favorite male teacher. But he didn't confront his Gayness until he was 15, when he came face-to-face with a middle-aged Gay man.

Paul was hitchhiking on a hot afternoon during the summer of 1981. He was wearing only a pair of shorts when a man offered him a ride. Paul says he got visibly excited as the man ran his hand up a bare leg; the 15-year-old's first sexual encounter followed.

A huge gullit trip accompanied the experience. Although Paul had enjoyed the Gay sex, he wasn't ready to accept his enjoyment as all right. The following month, he had sex with three women "to prove to myself I wasn't

Gay." He began wearing the most masculine clothes he could find, and hanging around with a "butch crowd" to show the world he was straight.

Not until March of 1983 - nearly two years after his first sexual encounter with a man - did Paul stop the self-denial. After extensive therapy he began to accept himself as Gay and to come out.

Both Paul and J.R. are now out to their families. Paul says his parents try to ignore the truth. "They try to forget, but they think about it a lot," he explains.

When J.R. came out, he was disowned by his real parents. That was a couple of years ago, and he has since lost touch with them, the last he knew, his father was in Minnesota and his mother in Texas. He now lives with a foster family on Madison's west side.

Both foster parents are supportive, so much so that J.R. has taken his mom to three Gay bars in town. "She loves all of them," he says with pride.

Both young men describe their adolescent years and their struggles for sexual identity as traumatic. They agree that the pain might have been eased if Madison had had a Gay youth center where they could have turned for advice, and also support from other young Gays. Recalling the years they both attended West High, Paul says, "A lot of people used to call him (J.R.) 'faggot', and wouldn't hang around with him." Paul accepted his own Gayness, but never approached J.R. for friendship; he was fearful that the name-caller might be wrong. It wasn't until one night recently when both men were in the same bar at the same time that each finally realized the other was Gay.

Paul thinks a Gay youth center would help eliminate guessing games such as he and J.R. played. "There's really no place you can talk," he says with dismay. That, he believes, only perpetuates the thought that "I must be the only Gay kid in school."

ED NOTE: The two young men interviewed for this story are not identified by their real names. The article was taken from the Madison, Wisconsin Gay newspaper "OUT".

Although Tucson does not have a Gay Youth Center, it does have a very active Gay Youth Group which meets every Saturday, from 3 to 5 p.m. at 560 S. Stone in the MCC Church building. All Lesbians and Gays under 22 are invited.



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# Tucson Lesbian And Gay Pride Committee Report

Your Committee went to much expense of money and time to produce the Political Forum that was held October 9th: We purposely scheduled the event outside of our bars to be able to demonstrate that, as individuals, and as a community we are ready to publicly confront the issues that oppress us. The hope was that with enough numbers of Lesbians and Gays in attendance, regardless of how many politicians showed up, we could demonstrate to this city, county and state that we are a force that must be addressed.

I had hoped that Lesbians and Gays in Tucson were tired of living in fear, tired of having to "pass" as heterosexuals to avoid discrimination. I had hoped we were strong enough to come out of our closets, out of our bars and show our oppressors that "We Are Here". Thirty Lesbians and Gays hardly makes a viable political and legal force. We turn out more people for drag shows, volleyball games, softball games and beer busts - all of which are very safe, fun activities, but unfortunately don't help change attitudes or laws.

The Tucson Lesbian and Gay Pride Committee is here to serve you. We are ready to work for you and with you to begin to achieve equality. The question I ask is are you, the community ready? We can easily continue to provide you with fun, party activities if that is all you want. The choice is yours. I for one am tired of discrimination. I am tired of living with the fear of being found out. I am ready to work to make a difference, to make change. Join me at the next TLGPC meeting if you are ready. The next regularly scheduled meeting is at the Fineline, 101 W. Drachman at 6:30 sharp.

Lesbian and Gay leaders from Tucson, Phoenix, Las Vegas and Reno met in Las Vegas last Saturday, Oct. 13, to plan a five-state conference. I represented Tucson at this meeting.

The beginning plans were made for a five-state Conference to be held in April, 1985 in Las Vegas. The Conference will be called "The First Desert States Lesbian and Gay Conference" with the theme of "Empowering Each Other". Lesbians and Gays from Arizona, Nevada, New Mexico, Colorado and Utah will be invited to attend this weekend event. The conference will consist of 20 to 30 workshops, a luncheon, keynote addresses from nationally known leaders and entertainment. Hopefully this will become an annual event and Tucson could become the host city in the future. The thought behind the conference and theme is to make this five state area a viable force in the national Lesbian and Gay rights movement. The next planning meeting is scheduled for Dec. 15 and 16 in Phoenix. Watch for further details.

Also please mark Monday, November 12 on your calendars. That is the date of our November TLGPC meeting which will start promptly at 6:30 p.m. and end at 7:30 p.m. At 7:30, a panel from the local law enforcement agencies will address the Tucson Lesbian and Gay community. Everyone is encouraged to be there whether you are a TLGPC member or not. This is an important forum and will give you an excellent opportunity to hear what you can do to help the law enforcement agencies and also what those agencies can do to help you.
