





AN OPEN LETTER TO THE GAY AND LESBIAN COMMUNITY

Every year during Gay and Lesbian Pride, our community celebrates its identity and our struggle for full civil rights. As exciting as marches and rallies are, the real battles are won in the voting booth. Remember Dade County and Eugene, Oregon?

In the state of Arizona there are approximately 270,000 Gays and Lesbians. How many of us are registered to vote? Not enough! If you aren't registered then you can't vote; if you don't vote, how can you ask for more rights when you won't use the ones you already have?

Here are the qualifications needed to register and vote:

* You must be 18 by the next General Election. This means you can register now if your birthday is before November 8.

* You must be a citizen of the United States and a resident of Arizona for at least 50 days before the next election.

* You must not have been convicted of treason or a felony (unless restored to civil rights) nor can a person who is insane vote.

* If you did not vote in the last General Election (for President of the U.S.) you will need to re-register.

* If you have changed your name, political party, or have moved to another county, you need to re-register.

* If you have obtained an Arizona Driver's License or State I.D. Card, you were given a chance to register at that time.

* If you have changed your address within the county, but not your name or party, you need to fill out a special change of address card, but not re-register.

* If you do not want to declare a political party, you are not eligible to vote in the primary election.

For the past few years I have been a deputy Voter Registrar for Pima County. I would like to make the following offer. Any group or business within the Gay community who would like to have me come to a meeting and register their members or want me to set up a table in their business on a particular night to register customers, should call me at 624-7382. I will be happy to work out something with them at no cost. The deadline for registering for the Primary Election is August 1. The deadline for the General Election is September 19.

One last thought to ponder - Jerry Falwell and the Moral Majority are conducting a major voter registration drive. Don't we owe it to ourselves to do the same?

WASHINGTON, D.C.-The Gay Rights National Lobby (GRNL) is looking for an experienced organizer to fill the position of Field Director. Susan F. Green, GRNL's current Field Director, will be leaving the organization effective approximately September 1, 1983. The Field Director is responsible for development and coordination of all GRNL programs and serves as direct supervisor to GRNL's two Regional Directors.

In addition to organizing experience, applicants should have strong administrative and communicational skills, supervisory experience and a willingness to travel. Starting salary is \$16,000 plus benefits. Women and ethnic minorities are especially encouraged to apply.

In reference to her resignation, Green stressed her support for GRNL and its Executive Director, Steve Endean. "It is important for people to understand that I believe in GRNL's agency and am completely supportive of Steve's leadership. I am proud to have been a part of the GRNL team."

"Susan has done a tremendous job of building and maintaining GRNL's field operations," commented Steve Endean. "She's made it the most sophisticated field network in our movement. I'm very disappointed that she is leaving, But I wish her the best. I certainly hope we find someone like Susan to carry on her work."

MIAMI, FL.-The 8th International Conference of Gay and Lesbian Jews will be held in Miami August 4 through 7th. The word "Miami" when translated into Hebrew becomes "Mi-Ami" and means "Who Are My People?" This fortunate coincidence provides a theme for the Conference which asks, "Who Are My People?" as Jews, as Gays and Lesbians, and as responsible adults.

A full schedule of workshops and religious services are planned. The South Florida Gay and Lesbian communities are going all out in support of the Conference. GAYS TO BE INCLUDED IN HOLOCAUST MUSEUM

WASHINGTON, DC (TWN)- A museum dedicated to the Holocaust will include non-Jewish homosexuals, the Washington Post reported. Documents from Nazi concentration camps indicate that Gays, Christians and political dissidents were among those persecuted during Hitler's reign of terror. The museum, costing between \$30-40 million, is scheduled to open in 1987 in Washington, DC.

L.A. OLYMPICS OFFERS GAY HOUSING

LOS ANGELES, CA - In anticipation of the thousands of Gay and Lesbian travelers during the summer of '84, Olympic Gay Housing ahs launched a campaign to roll out the Gay Welcome Mat. The organization, headed by veteran community leaders, has arranged for hundreds of residents of the Los Angeles Gay Community to rent their houses, condos and apartments to Gay visitors. Hotels are booked solid and many have expressed doubt about welcoming openly Gay people. OKLAHOMA BARS PUT ON NOTICE

OKLAHOMA CITY, OK-City Council members, responding to pressure from conservative constituents, have put five Gay bars in the city "on notice" that an effort will be mounted to close them down. The council received a large number of petitions from citizens who objected to Gay bars being allowed to remain open. The bars report a sharp increase in police activity in the area since the Council's action, and many patrons have complained of harassment and assault by police officers. (MGW)

PLAYBOY SURVEY SUPRISING ON GAYS

NEW YORK, NY (TWN)- Gay men and women can be as faithful as their heterosexual counterparts, a survey in "Playboy" magazine reveals. Long-term relationships are not uncommon among Lesbians and Gay men, according to a poll that was drawn from 80,000 readers' responses.

The study also reveals that: (1) Adolescent experiences might not shape later homosexual behavior; (2) Gay men are in "sexual overdrive" but Lesbians are more romantic; (3) Male "bisexuals" are considerably less happy with their sex lives than any other group, reportedly because they feel rejection from both sexes.

MAGAZINE CLAIMS FREUD'S DAUGHTER A LESBIAN

BERLIN, WEST GERMANY (MGW)-"Emma", a German feminist monthly, claimed in a recent issue that Sigmund Freud's daughter Anna was known to him as "my only son". Anna Freud died at 86 in London, where she fled with her lifelong companion in 1938 to escape Nazi prosecution. "Emma" claims that the two women were accepted as members of the family, who knew of their relationship. "Emma" made the assertion in answer to another publication's theory that Anna had sacrificed marriage in order to immerse herself in her and her father's work.

OBSERVATIONS

Our torn identities are being torn even more so every day. We have Gay Pride Marches, warnings about AIDS, news on the Gay liberation front.

Then we put ads in the paper seeking "very strong, all around good looking young Gay who likes taking orders, hard work, multiple duties. Live-in with 4 or 5 other guys. Must be highly sexual, versatile with smooth, defined muscular body." This is a thinly disguised call for a slave. How could he be a slave? He doesn't have to answer the ad does he?

In a society in which it is difficult for young people to get regular jobs, the voluntariness is decreased. Competition already tends to diminish the self-image of many people, especially young people. Straight society prejudices-makes many young Gays feel unworthy. The scene is set up to drive many, sad to say-many, young men to accept such offers, knowing at first they'll be much 'made over', some of them already turned opportunist, to the mutual degradation of slave and owners.

This is not Gay liberation or any other kind of liberation. We have joined the exploiters of our own kind. Because of the 'freer' sexual attitudes often translate not free but contemptuous), we slide into the very cynicism and mutual abuse of those who put us down.

There are many ways Gay characture each other and women; many ways we allow self-hate to determine how we use ourselves, and each other. This is NOT liberation. We have as many great resources of spirit, dignity and relationship as any other human being. Because of our suffering, we often have much more, unless we give in to the destructive values of the society around us.

We need to mull on what we do ourselves. As Lincoln once said, We must disenthral ourselves.

'OLYMPICS' INJECTION PERMANENT

SAN FRANCISCO, CA (GCN) - The U.S. Ninth Circuit of Appeals made permanent an injunction against the Gay Games use of the word 'Olympics'. U.S. District Judge Robert Peckham turned down the appeal of attorney Mary Dunlap to lift the ban. Peckham upheld the U.S. Olympic committee's claim that the use of the word confused the public about the nature of the games. Dunlap said, however, that the case will be pursued in a trial scheduled to begin later this summer.

Everyone (whoever in the HELL they ARE) says that the time to visit Palm Springs is during the winter, when the days are warm and the nights are cool! BULL SHIT! The summer is hot during the day and HOTTER at night. Flamming faggots fainting from fatigue flee for (San) Francisco; leaving local lads looking for love(rs, ing).

It is only a 6 hour drive from Phoenix to Cathedral City, contiguous to Palm Springs (where most of the action is). You must add about two hours for stopping and shopping at the busy rest areas. There are several options to visitors for spending a great weekend in Palm Springs. There are usually 20-30 men out enjoying the fell of the branches, bushes and things.


There are lots of THINGS to do in Palm Springs. Stop by the Chamber of Commerce office and pay 50¢ for a map. The golf courses, famous homes, etc. at least are worth a drive by. Don't forget to take the Tram-way up to the top of the mountain. The view is spectacular, the buffet is reasonable and good. Speaking of food there are some outstanding restruants (gay and non-gay) in the area. Surprisingly they are as inexpensive as Phoenix and Tucsom.

Bodies are everywhere. Drive down any street, sit by any pool or just stroll casually down Highway III and you will be delirious before dark.





Cranston Introduces AIDS Bill

S-1226, "AIDS Research Bill", has been introduced into the Senate Labor and Human Resources Committee by Senator Alan Cranston (D-Cal.). Though action has yet to be taken, S-1226 is the latest bill seeking a cure for AIDS.

- Other bills dealing with AIDS research are:
- HR-2350, "Health Research Extension Act of 1983", is on the House union calendar and is due for a floor vote at any time.
- HR-2713, "Public Health Emergency Fund", was presented to Reagan on July 1. He has not signed the bill, and is likely to veto it.
- HR-2763 is in the House Appropriations Committee. No action has been taken.
- S-1773, "Bio-medical Research Training and Medical Library Assistance Amendments of 1983", was introduced May 16, and while still on the Senate calendar, no action has been taken.
- S-792 has been replaced by S-1013 (same wording) and passed the Senate. It is now in the House Judiciary Committee.

Please Note: When writing your Senators and Representatives, the most effective method is a handwritten letter. Be very brief in support of a bill. Be certain to give the number of the bill and title. You must sign your full name and give address. Under these conditions you most likely will receive a clear answer from your Congressman, as he is more likely to read it.

A typed letter, being brief and giving bill number and title, is usually only read by a secretary. If you have signed your name and address, you will get the usual "careful" response.

The least effective method is the form letter to your Congressmen. Form letters are given a cursory glance and pitched forthwith into the trash, and are not even recorded. Even though you may have signed your name and address to the form letter, you have a slim chance of any kind of response. The best you could hope for is a vague form letter reply.

Generally speaking, Congressmen will ignore form letters. A quick call to your Congressman's office will confirm this. According to CDC (Centers for Disease Control - Atlanta), AIDS is now the Number One health emergency in the U.S. A new hotline has been established to answer questions about the disease:

REAGAN OPPOSES AIDS FUNDING

HR 2713 "Public Health Emergency Fund" for 1984 has passed the U.S. House of Representatives. This bill would allow 30 million each year to be spent to respond to any type of health emergency, including A.I.D.S. The problem is allocation. The battle over funding is spearheaded by Dr. Anthony Robbins (Director of the American Public Health Association) and Dr. James W. Curran, AIDS Project Director (Center for Disease Control, Atlanta). The battle is against foot-dragging by the Reagan Administration's Secretary of Health and Human Services, Margaret Heckler.

Dr. Robbins says in his plea for funds, "More money is needed for follow-up research, such as in New York City, and that should be a model for the Nation. The Reagan Administration has torn apart Hepatitis programs and is systematically destroying Herpes research programs."

Reagan has agreed to 12.5 million to go to AIDS research (which is outrageously low, 150 million would only be a beginning. Reagan is asking 60 million for El Salvador). Dr. Robbins quotes David Stockman as saying, "Reagan will veto any legislation on AIDS research exceeding the 12.5 million allocated earlier for research."

Representative Ted Weiss (Dem-N.Y.) is chair of a subcommittee which contains the gathering of information to advise financing, etc., on AIDS. Rep. Weiss says the committee needs review of scientific files on AIDS in order to prepare legislative action. The subcommittee has been refused such information. As Federal officials are nearly impossible to interview, and "research" scientists are "too busy to testify" because of the AIDS emergency, Congress is being denied the information. The "Budget Process" severely constrains the education process and information flow.

Gay people MUST contact our U.S. Senators and Representatives and demand more funding for AIDS research.






Grapefruit-Crab Cocktail Appetizer
 1 6 1/2 oz or 7 1/2 oz can Crab meat, chilled and drained
 1 Tbs. Lemon juice
 1 1-lb. can or 2 cups grapefruit segments, chilled and drained.
 1/2 Cup Mayonnaise or Salad dressing
 2 Tbs. Catsup
 1 Tbs. Lemon juice
 Few drops Tabasco sauce
 Flake Crab meat, removing bony bits. Sprinkle with Lemon juice. Alternate grapefruit and crab in lettuce-lined cocktail glasses.
 Combine remaining ingredients to make Sauce; chill, pour over.

Chopstick Tuna
 One 6 1/2 or 7 oz can tuna
 1 cup sliced celer
 1/2 cup salted cashews
 1/4 cup chopped onion
 1 can condensed cream of mushroom soup
 1/2 cup water
 1 can chow-mein noodles
 Combine cream of mushroom soup and water. Add 1 cup chow-mein noodles (1/2 of 3oz can), add all other ingredients. Toss lightly. Place in 10x6x1 1/2 inch baking dish. Sprinkle remaining chow-mein noodles over top. Bake at 375° about 15 min. or till heated through.

Pineapple-Nut Balls
 Drain well one 9 oz. can (1 cup) crushed pineapple. Mix pineapple with 1/2 pound marshmallows (about 32), cut fine. Let stand 1 hr. Fold in 1 cup whipping cream, wipped - cover; chill at least 3 hr.
 Shape in 8 balls and roll in 1 cup finely chopped toasted almonds. Keep chilled until serving time. Serve garnished with marashino cherry.


