


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TUCSON RUNNERS ENDURE

TUCSON - The two Tucson entrants in the Gay Run '83 held last weekend in San Francisco, Kim Hunter and Mark Dalton, finished the marathon in good style if not in first place. In the 5 kilometer race with 374 finishers, Kim finished 28th with a time of 19:47 against the winning time of 16:32. The winning female time was captured in this event by Oaklander Judi Sierra with a time of 20:05.

In the 10 kilometer race (6.2 miles), Mark Dalton from Tucson finished 25th in a field of 331 with a time of 47:05 against the winners time of 31:44 (Glenn Latimor from Illinois). Sarah Talbot from Berkley was the first female to cross the finish line in the race with a winning time of 38:39.

Both Hunter and Dalton are forming the Arizona FrontRunners Club (the Lesbian and Gay Running Club) which will meet each Tuesday at 7:00PM for sunset runs. The course will be determined by a consensus of those who show at the meetings. Call Kim Hunter Attitude, 622-7176 for more information.

AIDS Research Update

Resulting from the intense lobbying efforts of many Gay Right-Human Rights groups throughout this country, HR 2713, the "Public Health Emergency Fund" bill (Waxman, D-Cal.) is now law. This legislation will provide approximately 12.5 million for AIDS research.

The appropriation, however, is only a beginning, and an amount of 150 million would be a more realistic figure. This, while Reagan has asked 60 million to help defeat Human Rights in El Salvador.

HR 2713 was signed into law on July 13 and thus is the latest help for AIDS research. President Reagan recently announced that he would veto any AIDS funding in excess of 12.5 million. So other bills concerning AIDS funding may be in jeopardy of presidential veto.

S-1773 which was reported by a local group no longer is relevant to AIDS.

S-792 (S-1013) which was reported by a local group is no longer relevant to AIDS.

HR-2763 "Appropriations for Funds for 'Basic' Scientific and Medical Research on AIDS", was introduced April 28. The bill is self-explanatory except for the word 'Basic', and has been referred to the House Committee on Appropriations, where it now sits.

HR-2350 "Health Research Extension Act of 1983" (Waxman, D-Cal.), amends the Public Health Service Act to revise and extend programs regarding the National Institute of Health, medical research (AIDS) and health planning promotion. Pressure from our community is needed for this to ever become law.

S-1226 "To Amend the Public Health Service Act to authorize appropriations to be made available to the Secretary of Health and Human Services to respond to public health emergencies (AIDS)" (Cranston, D-Cal.), was introduced May 5, read twice and referred to the Committee on Labor and Human Resources May 10. The Committee requested executive comment from the Health and Human Services Department's treasury. NOTE: S-1226 could be stalled here. Apply pressure to Kennedy, Moynihan, Tsongas, Hollings, Glenn. Write each of them a letter, as this will get them to push even harder against our enemies, and will help ensure passage of this, the most important AIDS legislation thus far.

"Fix the light. Move it closer so's I can git a better look at him," the doctor said as his assistant moved the lantern closer. "Aaaaah! It's just as I feared: Smallpox!" Through the night they watched the soldier.

Out on the frontier during the Indian Wars medical help was hard to obtain, and for most of the nineteenth century your only hope against Smallpox was your natural immunity.

"He's made it — fever's broke!" proclaimed the doctor. Hours later the soldier, breathing in easy sleep, is wrapped in his army blanket. "Damned Indians! I hate 'em, wish they was all dead," said the Captain. "Why're we out here wasting our time?
