



**LETTERS**

I am pleased to announce that the California State Assembly has passed AB 1 by Assemblyman Art Agnos (S-San Francisco). This measure, which I co-authored, and was proud to vote for, outlaws job discrimination against Gay men and Lesbians.

This bill assures that Gays in California have the right to earn a living in an environment where they are legally protected from discrimination. The measure spells out in statute from the existing antidiscrimination law which is expounded in a Supreme Court ruling. This step is very important because currently few Gays facing job discrimination are able to assert their rights without costly and time consuming court suits.

This bill gives Gays the right to file job discrimination complaints with the State Department of Fair Employment and Housing rather than pursuing civil suits through the courts. However, it specifically exempts religious and nonprofit organizations from the proposed law. The bill makes it illegal for an employer to fire, refuse to hire or fail to promote workers because of their sexual orientation.

Surveys have shown that 60% of all Gays suffer some kind of employment discrimination. Assemblyman Agnos has worked for years to get measures similar to this passed by the State Legislature. This bill marks the fourth time in the last seven years he has proposed a similar bill. He is to be praised for his determination and diligence in this regard.

This measure now goes to the State Senate for consideration. We cannot afford to allow discrimination in our society. To condone discrimination against any group is to encourage discrimination against everyone. We must not allow such a signal to be sent. We must make our voices heard.

**NATIONAL AIDS LOBBY PROJECT FORMED**

NEW YORK, NY - In an effort to coordinate local efforts to combat the nation's "number one health emergency", more than 30 national and local community organizations have formed The National AIDS Federation with an AIDS lobby project to be based in Washington, DC. More than 100 groups are expected to join the effort. "The need for a united and coordinated effort to inform and assess our elected and health officials' response to the AIDS crisis has grown tremendously," noted Virginia Apuzzo, Executive Director of the National Gay Task Force and a temporary steering committee member of the AIDS Lobbying Project.

"As this health crisis has grown from the concerns of officials in major metropolitan centers, to a national health emergency that threatens the well-being of all Americans, we have found that a single voice to co-ordinate efforts for federal funding of medical research to combat Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome (AIDS) and to co-ordinate the efforts of federal agencies on behalf of persons with AIDS is needed," she added. The National AIDS Federation Lobby Project to begin efforts this summer will be staffed with lobbyist as well as support staff.

The creation of this project was decided at the recent Fifth National Lesbian/Gay Health Conference in Denver. The temporary Steering Committee members of the Lobby Project include Steven Endean, Gay Rights National Lobby; Virginia Apuzzo National Gay Task Force, and representatives from AIDS support groups from New York, San Francisco, Los Angeles, Philadelphia, Dallas, Houston, Chicago and Atlanta. People with AIDS will provide much needed direction to the effort. Funding for the lobby project has begun with commitment of more than \$100,000.

excellent organizing skills, as demonstrated by his efforts to secure labor support for gay civil rights. "The challenges ahead are formidable ones. But Vic will bring the experience, energy and sense of purpose to meet them. He'll have my strong support and that of the Board."

### HEALTH PERMIT SEMINAR

PHOENIX - On July 12th HOTBOD'S will be having a seminar at 9:30 A.M. for Health Permits. It will be open to anyone in the Gay community who wants to obtain a health permit. There will be a \$5.00 charge. The classes will be given by a Health Service worker.

WASHINGTON, D.C. - The Human Rights Campaign Fund, the national pro-Gay civil rights political action committee, today announced the appointment of Vic Basile, a Washington, D.C. - based Gay activist and labor union organizer, as the Executive Director. The Campaign Fund, in its first major elections in '82, raised over \$600,000 and won an extraordinary 81% of the Congressional races it entered.

Basile will be responsible for the overall operation of the Campaign Fund, including fundraising, media and public relations, staff supervision, and the critical oversight of the Campaign Fund's City Committees. Relations with other PACs and with candidates will continue to be supervised by HRCF's Treasurer, Steve Endean, who supervised the overall operation of the Campaign Fund until Basile's appointment.

The selection comes as a result of an extensive nationwide search process, with nearly one hundred resumes submitted to the seven member Search Committee. Peter Fenn, a non-Gay member of the Committee who had been with Democrats for the '80s, said, "The search process was the most open, exhaustive and unbiased that I've ever been involved with. We had a wealth of qualified candidates, and the Campaign Fund is fortunate to have had so many first-rate applicants."

Basile had been deeply involved in the labor movement and had helped lead the successful effort to gain endorsement of the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees for local, state and federal Gay civil rights legislation. He currently serves as Vice-President of Gay Activists Alliance of D.C., and as labor liaison for both Gay Rights National Lobby and National Gay Task Force.

"HRCF was enormously successful in 1982 and I believe its impact can and will be even greater in 1984. That effort will not be easy, but with the help of our unusually talented staff and board, I expect the Campaign Fund will achieve its ambitious goals," said Basile.

Endean, who is also Executive Director of the Gay Rights National Lobby, praised Basile, saying, "Vic has

### TUCSONANS IN GAY RUN '83

TUCSON - Kim Hunter and Mark Dalton, runners from Tucson, will participate in GayRun '83. The race will be held in San Francisco's Golden Gate Park on Sunday, July 17. Hunter ran in GayRun '81 and '82 finishing 41st out of 257 in 1981, and 16th in a field of 319 in 1982.

Hunter will be competing in the 5 kilometer race (3.1 miles) with plans to improve on last year's time. Dalton has entered in the GayRun for the first time this year and will be competing in the 10 kilometer (6.2 miles) race.

The Fourth Annual 5 and 10 kilometer races are sponsored by San Francisco Frontrunners, the San Francisco running club for Lesbians and Gay men. This year the race is a benefit for people with AIDS. Anyone interested in participating in GayRun '83 should call the Bay Area Physicians for Human Rights (415) 824-8740.

Hunter and Dalton have received donations from Rita's Rendezvous, and Joshua Tree/Back Pocket to help defray the cost of sending these two athletes to GayRun '83. Any additional donors are urged to contact The Attitude for address and telephone numbers.

 1/3 Cup Plum Jam  
 1/3 Cup Honey  
 1/2 Cup Ketchup  
 1/4 Cup Vinegar (Red Wine)  
 1/4 Cup Lemon Juice  
 1 tsp. Dry Mustard  
 1 tsp. Ginger  
 Salt to taste

In a saucepan, Saute onion and garlic in butter until onions are transparent. Add the remaining ingredients and simmer mixture for 5 to 7 minutes. In a dutch oven cook pork in simmering water for 30 minutes. Remove from pan and discard water.

Place partially cooked pork in roasting pan and bast on all sides with Barbecue Sauce.

Bake in 350° oven basting often for 35 to 40 minutes.



## MAYOR'S ENDORSE GRNL'S AIDS PROJECT

DENVER, CO. - The U.S. Conference of Mayors (USCM) adopted the AIDS lobbying agenda of the Gay Rights National Lobby (GRNL) after GRNL presented it's AIDS concerns at the Conference's national convention here. San Francisco's Mayor, Dianne Feinstein, who is Chair of the USCM's Task Force on AIDS, invited Jerry Weller, Co-Chair of GRNL's Board of Directors; Ginny Apuzzo, Executive Director of the National Gay Task Force; Dr. Roger Enliw, Director of New York City's Office of Gay and Lesbian Health Concerns, and several other public health officials to testify about AIDS before the USCM's AIDS Task Force.

In his testimony, Weller outlined GRNL's four top priorities in lobbying Congress: (1) Secure passage and presidential approval for the \$12 million 1983 Supplemental Appropriation for AIDS research. (2) Secure adequate funding for 1984 AIDS research of at least \$50 million. (3) Secure passage of the Waxman/Kennedy Bills (HR 2713 and S1226), which would establish a \$30 million Interagency Public Health Emergency Fund from which federal agencies could withdraw money to quickly combat health crisis like AIDS, Toxic Shock Syndrome or Legionnaires Disease. (4) Secure passage of the NIH Reauthorization Bills (one of these bills calls for the National Institutes of Health to establish expedited procedures for funding research on public health emergencies like AIDS.

After Weller's testimony and an extensive question and answer period, the USCM's AIDS Task Force unanimously adopted all four of GRNL's lobbying priorities.

Feinstein pledged that USCM lobbyists and mayors on the AIDS Task Force would move immediately to begin lobbying on these issues. "The U.S. Conference of Mayors is a very powerful organization, and I am very pleased that they have taken such a supportive stand on AIDS research," said Steve Edean, GRNL's Executive Director. 
