

### 24 HOUR GAY HOTLINE IN TUCSON

TUCSON - When you are new in town, it can be a little difficult trying to find out what's happening in the Gay and Lesbian community. When you are just coming out and you need to know where to find support and friendship, it can be real difficult. In Tucson, one phone call can put you in touch with the Gay and Lesbian community. Gay Christian Outreach Services (G.C.O.S.) is a telephone information and referral service operated by Metropolitan Community Church of Tucson. By calling their hotline, trained volunteers can direct you to commercial establishments, organizations and agencies that serve the Tucson Community. If you just want someone to talk with, that's O.K. Volunteers are there to listen and help about you.

The Hotline is staffed 24 hours a day, seven days a week by both men and women. G.C.O.S. volunteers care about you. They want to help. All information is confidential. Call the Hotline and discover your community. The Hotline number is 792-3772.

Organizations wishing to be listed with the Hotline should call the MCC office Monday through Thursday afternoons and talk with Rev. Dave Gunton about your listing. There are no fees charged, but contributions are accepted and are tax deductible.

### COMPLAINT FILED AGAINST POLICY OF AIDS EMPLOYMENT DISCRIMINATION

NEW YORK - On July 18, Lambda Legal Defense and Education Fund filed a complaint with the U.S. Department of Labor, stating that Columbia University is in violation of Federal law because of its policy of refusing to hire persons diagnosed with AIDS of the disease. Lambda alleges that this policy is in violation of Federal law that prohibits discrimination on the basis of disability. The Lambda action could result in the withholding of federal contracts from Columbia because of its policy.

Public Health officials including officials of the United States government have stated categorically that AIDS is not transmitted through ordinary contact in the workplace.

Lambda Legal Defense and Education Fund is expressly concerned with fighting discrimination against Lesbians and Gay men through litigation and public education.

### TLGPC ELECTIONS SET

Tucson - At the August meeting of the Tucson Lesbian and Gay Pride Committee held Monday, August 15, plans continued to formalize the organization. An outgrowth of the Lesbian/Gay Pride Planning Committee, TLGPC plans to be a year-round committee which will meet the second Monday of each month. The next meeting, September 12, will be an election meeting, when a Chairperson, Assistant Chairperson, Secretary, Treasure and three Members-At-Large will be chosen. A nominating committee will select names of persons to appear on the ballot and these selections will be sent to every business and organization in the Tucson Gay Community. At the September 12 meeting, additional names may be placed on the ballot prior to elections.

The September meeting will be held in the Chaparral room at the Finline at 6:30PM.

### BLACKS HELP GAYS FIGHT FOR CIVIL RIGHTS

Washington DC - Civil Rights, long an issue associated with Blacks, now is a rallying point within the Gay Movement, and the alliance between the two groups is growing. The Chair of the Congressional Black Caucus, Representative Julian Dixon (D-CA), as well as 16 others in the 20 member caucus, are co-sponsors of the Gay and Lesbian Civil Rights Bill. One fourth of the bill's co-sponsors are black, the highest percentage of any caucus in Congress.

The bill, H.R.2624, extends fair employment and fair housing laws to Gay and lesbian people. It is the brain child of the Gay Rights National Lobby (GRNL), an organization established seven years ago to fight for Gay issues in Congress. "There has always been Gay support for those fighting for civil rights and equality, including Blacks, women and religious groups," said Dixon. "Gays are strong civil libertarians." "Discrimination based on sexual preference is still discrimination, and we oppose discrimination of any sort."

### NATIONAL CANDLELIGHT VIGIL SET

WASHINGTON DC - Thousands of people will participate in a candlelight vigil on Capitol Hill in Washington on the evening of October 8. The announcement was made by the National AIDS Vigil Commission. The Coalition, formed under the aegis of Gay and non-Gay organizations, focuses national attention and public awareness on the syndrome that has already affected over 1,000 lives.

The AIDS Vigil is a single issue action highlighting discrimination against person with AIDS; to support the critical task of local and national AIDS organizations and to demand increasing crucial necessary federal funding for research of this dreaded disease. The Vigil Commission is comprised of and ever-widening group of congressional, medical, educational and business groups, unaccustomed to mass demonstrations. Nevertheless, our nation has never faced a health crisis of such magnitude in recent years as that presented by AIDS.

### HOLLY NEAR TO APPEAR IN CONCERT

Singer-songwriter Holly Near and Ronnie Gilbert of the Weavers will perform in concert at Gammage Center (on the campus of Arizona State University) on September 30th at 8:00PM.

The collaboration of Holly Near-one of the most important progressive singers and songwriters working today, and Ronnie Gilbert-best known as the "exuberant presence" and "soaring Contralto" of the pioneering folk group the Weavers-captured the hearts and minds of nearly 40,000 people who heard them during their 12 city tour this spring.

Representing two generations and over 30 years of progressive music tradition, the collaboration of Near and Gilbert made music history. All but one of their spring concerts sold out, and they recorded a live album at the Great American Music Hall in San Francisco. The album, LIFELINE, has just been released.

Accompanying Near and Gilbert will be Jeff Langley on the piano, whose work is also heard on LIFELINE. Susan Freundlich, sign language artist, will make the performance accessible to the hearing-impaired, as well as enrich the experience for the entire audience.

Audiences may want to purchase tickets early (virtually all their concerts were sold out in advance). Tickets are \$12.50 and \$10.50 at Gammage and Diamond's box offices (add 65¢ at Diamonds), Womansplace Bookstore (Tempe), Antigone Bookstore (Tucson), and Aradia Bookstore (Flagstaff). Tickets can also be ordered by mail from the Women's Center, 1634 N. 7th St. Phoenix 85006. (Enclosed Check for exact amount and self-addressed, stamped envelope.

Discount tickets for the hearing impaired are available at Valley Center for the Deaf (Phoenix), or they may be mail-ordered from the Women's Center. Discounts are also available for senior citizens. Free child care will be provided, but reservations for child care must be made by Sept. 27th. Call 966-9276.

PHOENIX - Are you familiar with the new organization, B.A.B.E.S.? If not you soon will be. With a present membership of around 40 people, the Society voted, at it's last meeting, to host Phoenix' Annual Halloween Ball. All proceeds from the "Ball" will be donated to a worthy cause, which will be decided at the next meeting.

B.A.B.E.S is open to employees and operators of gay-owned or gay-oriented businesses, and is intended as a non-union, social outlet. While still in its infant stages, B.A.B.E.S promises to become a driving force in the gay community, as well as an effective means of keeping the "Gay Dollar" in the community.

The Bar and Business Employees Association will elect its first officers in its next meeting, noon Tuesday, August 23 at CRUISING CENTRAL. B.A.B.E.S is also planning two fall events. On Sept. 18 the club will present the First Annual Great Spaghetti Feast and Variety Extravaganza at SAMMY'S. Tickets are \$6.00 per person for dinner and the show, which will feature the most varied assortment of talent this town has ever seen. tickets will be available by calling 231-0168 or at your favorite bar.

On October 30, B.A.B.E.S., in cooperation with REGAL PRODUCTIONS, will present "Halloween '83 -The Empire Ball". The PhoenixHilton Hotel has been chosen as this year's location for this event which annually proves to be a sell out. Tickets and information will be available soon.

### THE AIDS CONNECTION

WASHINGTON — Homosexuals and their defenders in our public discourse are encensed by the suggestion of Rev. Jerry Falwell that AIDS - a potentially fatal weakening of the body's immune defenses - is God's plague against the "Gays".

The counter to Falwell's argument is that AIDS strikes some people who aren't homosexuals - including drug users, hemophiliacs, and immigrants from Haiti. An even more fundamental objection, of course is that in this permissive day and age, it is unfashionable to talk about such matters in an ethical context.

Nonetheless, the evidence linking AIDS to homosexuality is massive - and has the homosexuals themselves extremely frightened. Of the first 1,700 cases diagnosed nationwide, more than 70 percent have involved homosexual men. Among the more than 600 known deaths from the disease, the proportion of male homosexuals is equally high.


In addition, there is now reason to believe that may AIDS cases among Haitian immigrants are related to homosexual conduct. NBC science correspondent Robert Bazell, writing in *The New Republic*, reports that many of the Haitians had had sexual contact with American Gays.

"There's simply no evidence," he says "to support the so-called 'Haitian Connection.'" When Haitian doctors interviewed the victims, they learned that at least one-quarter had worked as male prostitutes, meeting foreign gay men, mostly Americans...These Haitian men did not consider themselves homosexuals. In fact, there is a strong cultural taboo against homosexuality in Haiti...They had sold themselves in order to survive."

In like fashion, notes Bazell, it appears that intravenous drug users picked up the contamination from the homosexual subculture, that hemophiliacs may have done the same, and that the 100 or so women known to have AIDS got it from bi-sexual lovers. In other words, the linkage between the disease and homosexuality is even stronger than the 70 percent plus statistic indicates. AIDS is, in fact, a "gay plague," and then some.

Homosexuals are clamoring for research into the causes of AIDS and possible cures. No argument on that. In the meantime, however, some tough restraints on the bath house culture, blood-giving by homosexuals, and employment of "gays" in food handling and similar jobs would seem to be in order as simple precautions to protect the public health.



## COOKIN' WITH ATTITUDE



### MESQUITE-GRILLED FRESH TUNA

8 1½-inch-thick steaks (about 2 2/3 pounds total)

Juice of 1 large lemon  
8 Tablespoons (1 stick) butter  
Salt and freshly ground pepper  
Tomato-Basil Sauce (see recipe)

Prepare outdoor grill, heating coals until almost white. Top charcoal with 3 mesquite chunks and heat through.

Arrange tuna in shallow pans. Squeeze lemon juice over. Dot each with 1 tablespoon butter. Season with salt and pepper. Set pan on hot grill rack, but not over hottest part of fire. Cover and cook until opaque, about 25 minutes, depending on fire and thickness of fish. Top with sauce and serve.

### TOMATO-BASIL SAUCE

Makes 2 cups  
¼ cup (½ stick) unsalted butter  
4 medium shallots, minced  
1½ cups Fish Fumet\*  
4 tablespoons chopped fresh basil  
8 parsley stems  
3 tablespoons tomato paste  
1½ cups whipping cream  
Salt and freshly ground pepper  
Melt butter in heavy large skillet over low heat. Add shallots, cover and cook until limp, about 5 minutes. Add fumet and 2 cups tablespoons basil with parsley stems. Increase heat to

medium-high and reduce mixture by half, about 8 minutes, stirring occasionally. Reduce heat to medium. Blend in tomato paste and cook 2 minutes. Stir in cream and cook until reduced to 2 cups, about 15 minutes (sauce should be consistency of creamy vinaigrette). Discard parsley. Add remaining basil. Add salt and pepper. Serve warm.

### \*FISH FUMET

1 tablespoon unsalted butter  
1 medium onion, sliced  
1 small carrot, sliced  
2½ pounds fish bones and heads (from nonoily fish)  
¼ cup mushroom stems  
1 quart water  
1 cup dry white wine  
1 bouquet garnie (2 parsley sprigs, 2 thyme sprigs and 1 bay leaf)  
¼ teaspoon salt  
5 white peppercorns  
Melt butter in heavy 4-quart saucepan over low heat. Add onion and carrot, cover and cook until onion is translucent, stirring occasionally, about 10 minutes. Add fish bones and mushroom stems. Cover and cook until bones fall apart, about 10 minutes. Blend in water, wine, bouquet garni, salt and peppercorns and bring to boil. Reduce heat, cover partially and simmer until reduced to 2 cups. Strain into container and cool completely. Cover and refrigerate. (Fumet can be prepared several days ahead and refrigerated, or frozen several months.)
