

ARIZONA GAY BAROWNERS ASSOCIATION TO MEET IN TUCSON

TUCSON - The regular August 16 meeting of the Arizona Gay Barowners Association will be held on Tuesday, August 16 at The Finline. The Graduate will host the early arrivals on Monday evening where the group will meet at 6:00 p.m. and leave for dinner.

The actual meeting will take place on Tuesday morning. The Finline will open at 6:00 a.m. with coffee and/or eyeopeners for AGBA members only. A buffet will also be served after the meeting. The Finline will open at noon to the public and people invited to come by and meet member bar owners from the Arizona Barowners Association.

AGBA NEWS

The ARIZONA GAY BAR ASSOCIATION was formed in October of 1982. The main purpose of the association is to promote a good working relationship between the member bars and the community.

Currently the A.G.B.A. is planning FESTIVAL 1983 for Sunday October 23, 1983. The Festival will be a fund raiser for AIDS. To be held at South Mountain Park, the event will include all the beer, wine coolers, and food you can consume. Also will be hot music for dancing. Entire cost of the event is being covered by the A.G.B.A. member bars. The cost to the public will be \$3.00 per person with the entire \$3.00 being donated to AIDS research.

Recently the A.G.B.A. formed a weekly Pool League, which is made of teams from the member bars. The league, being very successful, has had a current season of 12 weeks. It will be followed by a fall season. Anyone interested in playing in the fall season can obtain information at any member bar.

One of the main goals of the A.G.B.A. is to keep our bars safe for all members of the community. At every monthly meeting, trouble makers and undesirable customers are discussed and made known to all members.

The A.G.B.A. is currently publishing a bad check list for all persons who have passed uncollectible checks in the bars. This list has been very effective in battling the passing of bad checks. If someone writes a bad check in one bar, now all of the member bars will know of it.

Presently, the A.G.B.A. Directory is being passed out in the bars. The directory lists all member bars.

The current officers of the A.G.B.A. are: President - Tommy from Tommy and Clydes, Vice-president - George from Hotbod's, Treasurer - Ron from Farrah's and Secretary is Cheryl - formerly of the Full Moon.

MORE LEGISLATION AIDS RESEARCH

HR-1697 "Public Health Emergency Research Act" (Waxman, D-Cal.), a bill to amend the Public Health Service Act to enable the Secretary of Health and Human Services to expedite the initiation of research to be conducted or supported by the National Institute of Health into the prevention, diagnosis and treatment of AIDS. This bill establishes a fund in the Treasury for such a purpose; such fund to be financed through transferred NIH appropriations. The bill is now stalled in the House subcommittee on Health and the Environment.

HR-2763 "Appropriations for Funds for 'Basic' Scientific and Medical Research on Acquired Immune Disorders and Related Opportunistic Infections". This newly-titled bill is self-explanatory except for the word "Basic", and is now stalled in the House Appropriations Committee.

HR-2350 "Health Research Extension Act of 1983" (Waxman, D-Cal.), amends the Public Health Service Act to revise and extend programs regarding the National Institute of Health, medical research (AIDS) and health planning promotion. HR-2350 is unstuck and moving through the House (July 25, 1983).

S-1226 "To Amend the Public Health Service Act to Authorize Appropriations to be made available to the Secretary of Health and Human Services to respond to Public Health Emergencies (AIDS)" (Cranston, D-Cal.), is still securely stuck in the Committee on Labor and Human Resources. The committee has requested executive comment from the Health and Human Services department. Though repeated requests have been made, the "executives" are as yet to act. They argue that they are too busy with the emergency. This bill is a "catch-22", no-win situation because of a block of the information flow - an obvious attempt by the Reagan Administration to stop the bill.

So far the only bill which has become law is HR-2713 (Waxman, D-Cal.) which was signed July 13, 1983 allowing a paltry 12.5 million for AIDS research. Reagan has maintained that he will veto any bill appropriating additional funds for AIDS.

MISHIMA'S LIFE TO BE PRESERVED ON FILM

TOKYO, JAPAN (GCN) - Filmmaker Francis Ford Coppola has announced his next project - a film biography of Japanese novelist Yukio Mishima, according to the Washington "Blade". Mishima, ardent militarist and ardent homosexual, committed ritual suicide in 1970. The film will be in Japanese and shot on location in Japan.

Coppola said about the project, "This unique man who made his life his art, appeals to many of my friends and associates in the United States."

PHOENIX "WOWS" RENO

Proud moments for Phoenix Arizona were many at the Reno National Gay Rodeo. Mary Carter, Miss Phoenix Gay Rodeo, was crowned Miss Top \$\$\$ Winner, raising the most money out of all other contestants in the Miss category. Mary was extremely well received by the crowds, as well as Miss Ebony and Mike Cooney. All won the hearts of everyone. We feel they were all real winners in Reno and Phoenix should be extremely proud to have been represented by these 3 people.

We are especially proud of Mary Carter, as this was the first year Phoenix had entered a candidate in the Miss category. She worked very hard, doing a fantastic job of raising the most money nationwide. Obviously Mary is in a class by herself. Playing a double roll in Reno, Mary was also part of the cast of "Best Little Whorehouse". The play, very well received, was performed to extremely large crowds on the midway stage and garnered several standing ovations for their flawless production. "The Whorehouse" has been asked by two other Rodeo's to perform for them. This is quite an honor, and is like icing on the cake. The Phoenix float which was entered in the Grand Entry Parade was beautiful and loved by the large crowd.

If you did not get to go to Reno and see not only the Rodeo but the "Whorehouse", you missed a hell of an event.

"OH, IT'S HIM AGAIN"

PLACERVILLE, CA (GCN) - Remember John Briggs? He's the former California state senator whose crusades against queers and for tougher death penalties brought him fame. The Briggs Initiative which would have made it illegal for Gays or Lesbians to teach in public schools or for anyone to portray homosexuality in a positive light in schools, was defeated by a massive statewide coalition effort in 1978.

Briggs was recently charged with a misdemeanor in a rifle-shooting incident at his home, according to the Sacramento "Bee". Apparently a process server went to Briggs' home to serve him a summons arising from a disputed plumbing bill. Briggs fired a shot in the direction of Chuck Putney, the server, after arguing about Putney's right to go onto this property to deliver the legal papers.

The district attorney decided that the offense was only a misdemeanor, even though it could have warranted a state prison term, because Briggs wasn't really trying to shoot Putney.

ANTI-GAY CARTOON PROVOKES PROTESTS

WASHINGTON, D.C. (GCN) - An editorial cartoon depicting presidential contender Walter Mondale reversing his support for Gay Rights because of AIDS drew vehement protests from 70 Washington "Times" staffpeople. In the cartoon, a caricatured Mondale is saying to a campaign worker, "With the AIDS scare on the rise, we'll have to start handling the Gay issue with kid gloves". The staff member replies, "Rubber gloves would be more like it, sir".

The objecting staff members, many of them news room employees, signed a petition of protest and delivered it to the deputy managing editor. On the following day, the paper published an editorial sympathetic to people with AIDS. The cartoon was also criticized by such diverse groups as the Mondale Presidential campaign, the National Conservation Political Action Committee and the District of Columbia Gay Activist Alliance.

Sanitation workers and police have staged noisy disruptive demonstrations lately, protesting work rules and pay increase limits. A \$2.3 billion transit system bond issue was overwhelmingly defeated and she has laid off 400 city employees because of the budget deficit.

On top of all this, Whitmire is under fire for having budgeted \$88,000 to collect data and mount an education program to fight AIDS in Huston. There are 25 cases of AIDS in that city, which has a sizable Gay male population.

CATALOG LISTS GAY BOOKS

NEW YORK, NY - Paths Untrodden, Gay-owned mail order service, offering "books of merit on the Gay male experience" has released it's 1983 catalog, listing more than 1,100 titles in 52 subject areas. This 1983 update of a yearly catalog focuses on those works, primarily by Gay authors which help Gay men understand and appreciate themselves.

Paths Untrodden specializes in hand-to-find books, small press, out-of-print and imported titles. Its catalog is updated several times a year though free supplements. Short articles are devoted to AIDS and the growing freedom from censorship of Gay literature. The catalog, a 46-page bibliography, is available for \$2.00 from Paths Untrodden, P.O. Box 459, Village Station, New York, NY 10014-0459.

ANTI-GAY BILL, "NATURALLY"

AUSTIN, TX (GCN) - Lesbian/Gay Rights advocates (LGRA) has announced the quiet, timely and "natural" death of anti-Gay legislation with the close of the 68th session of the Texas Legislature. H.B. 2138, the anti-Gay bill was introduced by Rep. Bill Ceverha, and would have recriminalized "deviate sexual intercourse, intimate sexual contact and homosexual contact". It also would have expanded laws pertaining to public lewdness and indecency with a minor. (See Altitude, Vol. 1, Issue 2).

LGRA staff, in their postmortem, attributed the death of H.B. 2138 to three things. First, four witnesses against the bill testified at the committee hearing and helped to correct inaccurate information presented by the bill's supporters. Second, committee members were inundated with mail expressing opposition to the bill. And third, the bill's unconstitutionality was given in testimony as compelling reason not to discharge the bill out of Committee.

COMPLAINT FILLED AGAINST POLICY OF AIDS EMPLOYMENT DISCRIMINATION

NEW YORK, NY - On July 18, Lambda Legal Defense and Education Fund filed a complaint with the U.S. Department of Labor, stating that Columbia University is in violation of Federal law because of its policy of refusing to hire persons diagnosed with AIDS of suspected to be transmitters of the disease. Lambda alleges that this policy is in violation of Federal law that prohibits discrimination on the basis of disability. The Lambda action could result in the withholding of federal contracts from Columbia because of its policy. Public Health officials including officials of the United States government have stated categorically that AIDS is not transmitted through ordinary contact in the workplace.

Lambda Legal Defense and Education Fund is expressly concerned with fighting discrimination against Lesbians and Gay men through litigation and public education.

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

AH! MID-AMERICAN meat on the hoof; two and four legs. Although Kansas City is not the BEEF CAPITOL anymore it runs a close race for the title of HUNK capitol. In one delightful way KC reminds a cow town: Hunky Horny cowboys and farmers still come to town for weekends of fun, booze and sex.

The gay scene in KC has always been a real treat. Bars range from Disco to quiet cruize bars. The locals are friendly and will strike up conversations or buy drinks without sex being the primary object. For those of you into a little excitement; the parks (particulary Liberty Memorial Mall) are HOT with TRICKS and COPS. Some caution should be used approaching a trick because he may have two guns that shoot.

Although KC retains some of the charm of a cowtown it is a modern beautiful city with enough attractions to keep you going for weeks. 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STORM

An oppressive storm is building, soon it will be raging if political rumor is correct. Our problem, as Gay people, is to understand the power of the shifting wind. In each case of a failed civilization there have been countless signals of the impending disaster to come, but the leaders were blind and deaf. And such is the case with the movement of the Lesbian and Gay community for minority status — for social and legal equality.

In our case, the current Republican leadership is not only blind and deaf, but insane as well. The current storm of political-social oppression, bad inflation, unfair taxation, boosting of awesome military effort, and blind obedience to an outdated and unworkable system have us walking into the wind of destruction.

The roaring thunder within the current Republican Right-Wing storm is almost overhead if you observe creatures like James Watt, with his vicious assault on our environment, Reagan's attack on the the elderly via Social Security, the obvious attempt by the New Right to reverse the progress in Lesbian and Gay Rights. AND the most effective block as yet: AIDS, for which I personally believe Reagan and the CIA are somehow responsible.

The resistance to these efforts, once again, shows history repeating itself. In order to bring this era of oppression to an end, we must form a 'new wave' within the Democratic Party, new definitions of 'family', Gay equality, civil rights, same-sex parents, a review of sexual "property rights", the education of the young to a "realistic" world as the old 'nuclear family' experiences a *melt-down*.

As openly Gay and Lesbian people, we greatly fear what could (and has) happened as a result of the Reagan Administration efforts in Washington. One cannot say for certain what the final result will be, but one can say with certainty what some of the forks in the road will be. In the current Far Right Republican administration, calls are being made for:


- Halting the progress of racial interaction,
- The destruction of the Voting Rights Act of 1964 (attempt made but stopped),
- Racial, sexual (anti-homosexual, anti-Lesbian) prejudice under the guise of immigration control,
- The acceptance of class differences,
- The insertion of the values of particular religions into law, including the codifying of religious views and values on sexual behavior (anti-Gay, anti-Lesbian) into the criminal statutes,
- Movement away from arms control, growing arms competition, multiple small wars and a growing danger of the final war,
- The destruction of harmony with our natural environment (Watt) with the removal of pollution control,

- The destruction of a social order in which technology and large-scale organizations were designed and developed as to serve human needs (technology and large scale organization in the current reign is irrevocably becoming our master — not our servant),
- The destruction of a society in which the media are free and internal communication untrammled (we are increasingly falling victim to the limitless possibilities for manipulation of information inherent in modern social organizations).



These are only a few of the more fateful choices. The phrase "fork in the road" is not quite suitable because it suggests a single point in time at which a decision is made. On any of these items listed, the outcome will be the cumulative result of many decisions made over time. Also the phrase "fork in the road" suggests more freedom of choice on our part than is actually the case. There are powerful historical forces at work, and our contemporary decisions, as Gay men and Lesbians will only partially determine the outcome.

Your democratic political district has recently been assigned new boundaries due to population pressure. If you would like to see continuing support for the rights of Gays and Lesbians (and all other minorities), if you feel a need to contribute new ideas, progressive ideas, and to push the Democratic Party further into the area of Civil Rights, or, if you feel that it is in your best interest as a Gay person that the social voice (your voice) should have more impact on all of us, contact your Democratic Party District Chairperson (see maps below).

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
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
