

## REAGAN INSENSITIVE TO WOMEN, NOW SAYS

CHARLESTON, S.C. (AP) - Ronald Reagan "shows insensitivity to women" and must be drummed out of office next year if the gains the women's movement has made over the past 16 years are not to be lost, leaders of the National Organization for Women (NOW) said last Saturday. Alice Chapman, the national treasurer for NOW, told about 150 delegates to the group's South Carolina state conference that Reagan's election was a blow to the women's movement.

"We elected a president who's not only against the Equal Rights Amendment, but of a party that had removed the ERA from its platform," she said. Former NOW President Karen DeCrow suggested that the administration simply is not conscious of the national mood about women's issues. "I do not think Ronald Reagan is a vicious male chauvinist," said DeCrow, an attorney from Syracuse, NY, who was NOW president from 1974 to 1977. "I think it's innocense. I think that the administration is totally unconscious about what they are doing."

Chapman criticized Reagan's record on appointing women and minorities to Cabinet-level positions, while acknowledging that the president did appoint Sandra D. O'Connor, the first woman Supreme Court justice. But she added that "appointing one woman justice is not equal rights for all the women in the nation."

## FINELINE PARKING DWINDLES AS PIMA COLLEGE HARASSES PATRONS

TUCSON - Pima Community College security police have stepped up their patrols and have been harassing Fineline patrons for the past two months about parking in the vacant lot owned by the College at the corner of Drachman and 9th Avenue. Dick Plowman, Fineline owner, said that he has had the full permission of PCC authorities to use the parking lot since the bar first opened. He cited a change in the head of the Security Police at PCC authorities to use the parking lot since the bar first opened. He cited a change in the head of the Security Police at PCC as a probable reason for the increase of patrolling the lot, the interrogating of Fineline patrons and general harassment. This increased patrolling by PCC police has caused an increase of reports to PCC officials apparently, and hence the decision to stop all public parking in the lot which lies directly across 9th Avenue from The Fineline.

Plowman has said that there has been no increase in illicit activities in the lot and he can find no reason for the increase in patrols. He stated that he is at a loss as to why the decision was made to stop public parking except that there was a change in the head of security, and that it has nothing to do with his patrons. The lot was cleaned regularly by Fineline personnel and security maintained by Fineline security forces.

For the present, Fineline patrons are requested to use parking facilities other than Pima Community College parking lots. Patrons are also cautioned against using the lot to the south of The Fineline which belongs to an apartment complex. Both lots will tow cars away at owners' expense. Available Fineline and street parking is recommended until the PCC matter can be resolved or other parking is secured.

## AIDS-RELATED ORGANIZATIONS INVITED TO JOIN NATIONAL FEDERATION

NEW YORK, NY - The 38 founding organizations of the Federation of Aids-Related Organizations (FARO) are extending an invitation to all organizations around the world who have Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome (AIDS) on their agenda to join with them in an exciting effort to coordinated AIDS activities both here in the United States and internationally. Over 100 groups joining hands in what has become a political battle as well as a medical and community one, will serve to energize all member organizations in what is now being seen as a long, tough fight," noted Ron Vachon, Executive Director of the National Gay Health Education Foundation, Inc., and interim director of the Resource/Information Project of FARO.

Funding for the Lobbying Project has begun with commitment of more than \$100,000. The Resource/Information Project, currently in a needs-assessment phase, is being funded for this phase by assessing each of the founding 38 groups a minimum of \$50. PHILADELPHIA, PA (GCN) - It's a little late to report on but it is certainly a worthy report. The first and only Gay high school in the United States, Byton School-Eromin, held commencement exercises on June 14 for its class of 1983. In its first year, the school is associated with Eromin House, a group home for Gay teens.

The graduating class of four students, three men and one woman, had a ceremony like most other high school graduations, except the class was all Gay. According to the Advocate, parents who only months ago could barely accept a child's Gayness were all smiles and tears at the happy occasion.

## WALL STREET JOURNAL REJECTS GAY BANK'S AD

SAN FRANCISCO, CA (GCN) - A help wanted ad submitted to the Wall Street Journal by the Atlas Savings and Loan was rejected for publication recently, according to the Bay Area Reporter. The ad was rejected in a letter which said, "Your proposed advertising copy was submitted to the New York Committee for acceptability and was declined for publication."

The ad, for a chief executive officer, identified Atlas as "the world's first financial institution organized by Lesbian/Gay persons to serve the Lesbian/Gay community." Although the ad made no specification that the applicant must be Gay or Lesbian, it was apparently because of the Gay/Lesbian identification of the bank that the ad was rejected.

El Paso has an urban sprawl problem similar to Phoenix and worse than Tucson. It spreads around mountains like a snake between the Rio Grande. The real beauty of the city can only be appreciated from the various view points on mountain drives at night. It reminds you a lot of Phoenix from Camelback. One distinct advantage is that the freeway system is better.

Juarez, located just across the river from El Paso is one of the largest cities in Mexico and is a real bargain. You can get a good steak dinner for two with a couple of drinks for under \$10. Drinks at most bars are .40-.50¢. You can visit a glass factory where hand craftsmen still make hand blown glass objects.

A couple of hints on visiting Juarez: If you are going over to get smashed, use the walk across bridge, or you stand a good chance of getting your car smashed also. If you are going shopping for some of the many great bargains in leather, glass, onyx, etc., drive across so that you can go to the better shops. The main streets on the walk across bridge are loaded with beggars, hustlers and some pretty shady places. The street vendors really think you are a DUMB American if you pay the first price asked. Part of the fun is the haggling over money. The better shops are usually priced as marked.


Gay life in El Paso has slipped somewhat in the past couple of years. Several people including bartenders said that AIDS had really scared people. That is hard to believe since there has only been one case reported and he was an import from another city. The people are friendly and interested in hearing about gay life in other cities. The ATTITUDE went over very well - everyone seemed interested in a similar publication there.

My favorite bar was The San Antonio Mining Co. It has a nice patio with a circular bar under a Gazebo type structure. It gets a nice afternoon crowd and is cruisy. A lot of HUNKS hang out there at night and the rectangular inside bar is just as cruisy. Another place "The Old Plantation" is owned by the same person and is a very popular DISCO. The other bars are smaller - about on the order of the Graduate - but draw nice crowds. Of course there is a large Chicano population, but there are some real neat Latin Lovers.

If you plan on visiting El Paso take the time to drive the extra 75-100 miles to Carlsbad, New Mexico for a day at the caverns, truly one of the most beautiful sights of nature.
