

### A.I.D.S and Advisors

The cold handshakes and political whispers still filtering down from moderate politicians, their aids and advisors, have us now suspecting that the Arizona Department of Health may be the Chosen One in the latest rumored move by the ultra-conservative Arizona Legislature to further oppress the lesbian and homosex minority.

The rumored idea is to get a bill introduced into the legislature by a local group of ultra-conservative, anti-homosex (anti-sex) "citizens". Word has it that the bill is soon to be complete and its advocates ready for a fight. While the exact wording is as yet undisclosed, certain phrases have been hinted at: "Any private or public gathering place wherein homosexuals work or congregate..." and "...for their and the public safety at large is to be guaranteed". Should something of this type actually be written into law, it would mean bars, baths, restaurants, businesses (your home?), salon, etc. could be singled out for closure as a health hazard. Moral Majority leader Jerry Falwell has been vocally calling for just such action on a nationwide basis. He is not alone in his quest to stamp out this "sub-animal behavior", as he calls it.

We can only hope that the warnings are misleading, though in years past such whisperings have proved factual. This is indeed an incredible threat from the political right, since the Health Dept. can and would act under the threat of "plague" to close such places of "contamination" for the safety of the public.

Be advised, these rumors spring from political activists and advisors involved with the drafting process. Activists among the homosex and likesex groups fear a purge is due as a result of A.I.D.S. and the public ignorance regarding it. Example: The serious nationwide blood bank shortages brought about by the mass hysteria about A.I.D.S. The fear that a new and clean needle placed in your vein will give you the disease. Such misunderstandings are in the heads of people who vote, and anti-homosex legislation is doubtless in the offing. Hopefully, intensified lobbying and education of legislators can persuade them of the historic realities and dangers of such legislation. For if such a finger-pointing law is turned over to the Health Department and the police, they will have no choice under the current climate of fear and prejudice but to enforce it, and that would slam the lesbian and homosex liberation movement not into a closet, but into a coffin. We must organize our efforts now against this politically dangerous threat.

If you are interested in banding together in this political struggle all that is required is a personal belief that you are neither evil, sick, nor inferior; able to be on duty from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. (starting in January); willing to speak as an openly homosex person *unafraid* to legislative groups; expecting no payment, as this is purely volunteer work for and from our community. We must be prepared!

### FLAGSTAFF GAYS ORGANIZE

A group of twenty gay men and lesbians recently got together to form the first gay support group in the Flagstaff area in recent years. It was decided at the organizational meeting on August 31, 1983 that the group will be called the Gay Alliance of Northern Arizona. (G.A.N.A.).

Also at the August 31 meeting it was discussed that G.A.N.A. will be an organization without a lot of structure and that anyone interested in the group would be able to come the meetings at anytime.

One of the main functions of G.A.N.A. will be to coordinate the gay support group meetings. The support group will meet, it was decided, every other Wednesday (Sept. 28, Oct. 12, etc.) at 7:00pm at 519 N. Leroux Street in Flagstaff. All gay men, lesbians and friends of the gay community are welcome to attend the meetings.

Another function of the group will be to organize a gay outreach in northern Arizona. "Outreach is presently working pretty well on the Northern Arizona University campus", said G.A.N.A. member Terry Kampf, "but we need to get a few more permanent residents involved."

Kampf also stated that G.A.N.A. will work closely with some of the other organizations in Flagstaff that might be sympathetic to the gay cause.

### GAYPAC SEEKS VOLUNTEERS FROM COAST TO COAST

Tampa, Fl. - The National Gay Political Action Committee, GAYPAC, is looking for volunteers, Gay and non-Gay, to help Gays get registered to vote in 1984. "We want people to go knocking on doors", said J. Shepard, Chairperson of GAYPAC. "We want to take the work right into the Gay home. That way, our volunteers can urge Gays to register and vote, even help them fill out the registration forms, while surrounded by their loved ones."

The National Gay Political Action Committee is fully registered with the Federal Election Commission in Washington, D.C. and support candidates who support gay rights and opposes candidates who oppose Gay rights. Through the new volunteer program and GAYPAC'S new voter registration drive for 1984, GAYPAC'S goal is to bring the largest Gay voter turnout seen for a Federal election.

"Too many Gays across the country are still unaware of the importance of participating in the political process. It's going to take at least a hundred thousand volunteers coast to coast working hard for the turn-out we need," said Mr. Shepard. "We're asking potential volunteers to write GAYPAC headquarters here in Tampa telling us they want to volunteer. We'll take it from there." ### ARIZONA AIDS FUND MEETS IN TUCSON

Tucson - The Arizona AIDS Education and Research Committee held an extraordinary board meeting in Tucson last Friday, September 16. Board members from both Phoenix and Tucson met with heads of several gay organizations from the Tucson area to familiarize them as to what is happening with the Fund on a daily basis, to discuss fund raising ideas and to see what the Tucson Gay community needed in the way of assistance from the Fund.

Approximately 30 persons were in attendance at the meeting which was presided over by Bob Hegyi. Also in attendance were two victims of AIDS and Linda Stanley, sister of Charlie Stanley, owner of Trax who succumbed to the disease on September 8. Mr. Hegyi informed the group that there were 29 diagnosed cases of AIDS in Maricopa county and six deaths.

The current treasurer's report showed that the Fund has raised a total of \$8,033.40 and disbursed \$4,174.95 leaving a balance as of August 31 of \$3,758.45. The major disbursements were a donation of \$1,000 to the Center for Disease Control in Atlanta and a \$2,000 donation to the gay Rights National Lobby (GRNL) to assist in their lobbying efforts in Washington for more AIDS funding.

### THEME SET FOR GAU NATIONAL CONFERENCE

San Diego, Ca. - "The Challenge of 1984: Together We Can Make a Difference" has been set as the theme for the 9th National Conference of the Gay Academic Union in San Diego during Thanksgiving weekend, November 25-27, 1983. The San Diego Chapter of GAU, which is hosting GAU9, is seeking proposals for presentations in lectures, panel discussions, seminars and workshops during the three-day event. Proposals for formal research presentations, roundtable discussions, performances and workshops should be sent to GAU in the form of abstracts of 300 to 500 words accompanied by a biographical data sheet. They should be sent to GAU9 Program Committee, P.O. Box 82123, San Diego, Ca. 92138.

Past national conferences of GAU have drawn between 300 and 600 participants. This will be the first year one has been held in San Diego. Previous conferences were in New York, Los Angeles and last year in Chicago.

"I'm sweet sixteen and never been kissed. I'm experiencing inner feelings I've never felt before. I'm starting to fantasize about sexual matter, but can't express my true feelings to anyone at this time. A lot of things are happening all at once and I'm starting to become more confused as time goes on. I want to talk to someone about my thoughts and emotions but there is no one."

Sound familiar? If we haven't said it ourselves, I'm sure there are countless others who have said the same thing. For young people whose thoughts and emotions may indicate they are gay, there are many excellent books on the subject at our local bookstores who stock Gay publication (Books Brothers, Ltd. in Tucson or Womansplace Bookstore in Tempe are two excellent sources). One book that I particularly liked was written by Frances Hanckel and John Cunningham, "A Way of Love, A Way of Life; A Young person's Introduction to What it Means to Be Gay" (Lothrop, Lee and Shepard Books, 1979).

In his introduction, Deryck Calderwood, Associate Professor of Health Education and Director of Human Sexuality Program of New York University, clearly sees a need for such a book. "What has long been needed is a book for youth that recognizes the variety and validity of love styles that exist between human beings. There should be a resource for Gay and bisexual young people that shows sincere understanding of the difficulties they encounter growing up as a sexual minority among a largely homophobic majority...It would present the prevailing view of social and physical scientists that gender identity and erotic preference are established very early in life...Such a book would present word portraits of representative Gay individuals happily going about the business of living fulfilled and productive lives...The tone of the book would also be important; it would provide accurate information in a warm, human manner. It wouldn't be an academic or medical treatise. It would be a book about living and loving. I have looked a long time for such a book. I feel this one is it."



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
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
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**P.S. YOUR CAT IS VERY MUCH ALIVE!**

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


