



## MCC TUCSON MOVES TO NEW CHURCH BUILDING

TUCSON — On Sunday, October 2, Metropolitan Community Church of Tucson, (MCC) will move to new and large facilities and install their new pastor, at the same time. After three years in South Tucson and outgrowing that building, the church with a special ministry to the Gay and Lesbian community, will be moving to larger quarters in the former Temple Emanuel, 560 South Stone. The Temple was built in 1910 and was the first Jewish Synagogue in the Arizona Territory. The Jewish congregation moved in 1949 and various Christian congregations have used the building since that time.

Dedication services for the new building will be held at 10:45am on Sunday, Oct. 2 with the Reverend Bob Arthur of Long Beach officiating. Reverend Dave Gunton, Pastor of MCC—Tucson will be installed at that time as well.

"The Olympics will be spectacular", say O.G.H. co-Director Jeanne Cordova, "We want to add that special Gay ambience."

Hotels are booked solid, and many have "reservations" about welcoming open Gays. For those who want to relax and not worry about living in the closet during their Olympic vacation, O.G.H. will offer the kind of privacy and environment the Gay and lesbian

### MEXICO REPORTS NINE CASES OF AIDS SINCE JUNE.

MEXICO CITY, MEXICO (AP) — Doctors in Mexico are reporting increased incidence of acquired immune deficiency syndrome (AIDS), a leading pathologist said. At least nine cases of AIDS have been reported around the country since the first case in Mexico was reported in June, said Estanislao C. Stanislawski, chief pathologist at Social Security Hospital.

In a statement published in the government newspaper El Nacional, Stanislawski warned Mexicans to stay away from bars and restaurants run of frequently visited by homosexuals to avoid contracting the disease, which can be transmitted in the blood, saliva or sperm.

He said at least nine cases had been reported at state hospitals around the country, most of them in border areas and the two biggest cities, Mexico City and Guadalajara - all regions where there is frequent contact with U.S. citizens.

### Editors Comment:

The above is a reprinted article that appeared in last Sunday's Tucson Daily Star (Sept. 25, 1983) and is typical of the type of uneducated information that is being perpetrated by the straight press. There is no wonder that the straight society is pointing to us as disease carrying sinners. From this article it is apparently evident to the Associated Press, at least, that United States homosexuals are responsible for Mexico's nine cases of AIDS. Although there is no confirmation on just how AIDS can be transmitted, the Associated Press wants us all to know that it can be imparted by blood, saliva or sperm.

Last but not least, the population of Mexico City is nearly 14 million (1978 est.), Guadalajara, nearly 3 million (1978 est) and the border between Mexico and the U.S. which runs nearly 1,500 miles, is lined with some of Mexico's larger cities. Nogales, Sonora, just across the border from Arizona has been estimated at over one million. Surely there is need for concern, but to make such a blatant issue of nine cases (so far) in cities with populations such as these is surely scare tactics on the part of the Associated Press and Dr. Stanislawski.


