

Crane fell victim to his own weakened moral fiber three years ago when he had a brief sexual affair with a 17-year old female House Page. Crane and his colleague, Rep. Gerry Studds, have both been recommended for official reprimand because of sexual relationships with female and male pages, respectively. In the fallout of the House investigation of their activities, Crane apologized to this wife and six children, while Studds came out to the world.

DID YOU SEE?

There is a new trend on the left these days to support individuals who are in the military and want to stay there. No longer are civil libertarians championing only the cause of the CO who wants to get out of the military; they are also supporting the oppressed who want to stay in. We're referring to the Left's response to the recent witch hunts of our fighting forces. These purges have left no stone unturned: They have involved 24 of the 61 women on the USS Norton Sound in 1980; 40 of the 300 women stationed in Memphis, TN; 12 of the 102 women on the USS Dixon in 1982 and a Lt. Joann Newak of the Air Force. Many of these women were acquitted of the charges against them. Some were discharged. And Joann Newak was sent to Leavenworth for 6 years at hard labor.

Notably, many of the women charged are not Lesbians but are victims of the backlash against women which is taking place in all the branches of the military, most prominently in the Navy. The irony is that these women are getting support from the Left so they can stay in the Military. And in some cases, women who are Lesbians are denying their Lesbian identities. An example is Robin Bruce, who was a Boatswain's Mate on the submarine tender Dixon. She initially denied that she was a Lesbian. It wasn't until after she appeared before a military board and was officially discharged from the service that Robin admitted to being Gay. In the meantime, the Gay and Lesbian community in San Diego, not to mention the ACLU and NOW, spent time and energy raising funds for legal defense for Robin and two other accused women from the Dixon (who were later reinstated because they were found "not guilty" of the charges against them).

When we hear of yet another case of a Lesbian or Gay man being tossed out of the Navy, Air Force or Army we say, "What right has the military to exist?" Except when the military is over zealous in its punishment of those who don't conform to the rules and regulations, as in the case of Lt. Newak, let's help those who want to get out of the armed forces, not those who want to stay in. Yes, it is important that we fight the regulations that give Gays a bad discharge. But we're better off spending our time and energy telling kids who go into the military looking for adventure and a way out of joblessness that chances are they'll be worse off when they get out than when they went in. (Resist, June/July 1983)

AIDS TOPS MORAL MAJORITY LIST

In the latest mail out from Jerry Falwell's organization, "On" Ronald Goodwin, Executive Vice President of the "Moral Majority," is pleading for funding from unfeeling, unthinking "Private Citizens" for the founding of a program involving lobbying in Washington to "Stop the Spread of the Deadly Disease AIDS, which is plaguing our nation."

Note that Goodwin does not mention the word "homosexual" or "gay" (this is a first). Also, he doesn't mention finding a cure for AIDS, only to "stop the spread" and by this brutal language his intent is not only to stop the spread of AIDS but to increase the fear and misunderstanding now "plaguing" our nation on this subject, and of course, stop us!

There is no longer a need to use the homosexual with the word plague or AIDS, that connection is now made in the minds of unknowing people. All "Dr." Falwell has to do is mention AIDS to these people and the Anti-Homosexual money and legislation comes rushing in. We MUST understand that the word homosexual in the strange minds of the unknowing public has been replaced with the word "plague."

POOL DISINFECTED AFTER GAY GROUP'S SWIMMING PARTY!

TULSA, OK (GCN) - The city of Tulsa drained and disinfected a municipal swimming pool here to allay residents' fears of contracting AIDS. According to the Tulsa Tribune, a Gay rights group had rented the pool for a private party the preceeding weekend and Recreation Department officials decided to drain the pool after they received two calls from worried citizens.

Brian Murney, spokesperson for Oklahomans for Human Rights, the group renting the pool, expressed the concerns of another group of worried Tulsans - the Gay community. "We're afraid the general community will pick up on those key elements - gays, pool, AIDS - and miss the finer points about how the disease is actually transmitted," Murney said.
City officials have admitted that they may have over reacted and at least one has called the draining and disinfecting operation a "public relations gesture." Murney noted that it was "politically the easiest thing to do." But he added, that his group was shocked at the city's response to callers' unfounded fears.

A LETTER TO THE EDITOR & THE GAY COMMUNITY

Today I stood beside a hospital bed in Phoenix, watching my friend die. There was absolutely nothing I could do for him but hold his hand and keep a cool towel on his head and a few encouraging words. His name was Charles Stanley, better known to his friends as "Charlie". I had known Charlie for many years. He was the owner of a very popular bar in town, Bullwinkles, which later became Trax. Charlie had struggled for many years to be his own boss. I could certainly relate to that because I too, for many years had wanted my own business.

Things finally seemed to be going well for Charlie and then one day he woke up to a spot on his eyelid. That was the beginning of a long losing battle for him. Within the next few months, Charlie was to have five hospitalizations. Although his medical care was superior, (I had never seen such concern and care by medical doctors, nurses and staff over a gay brother), his six month battle with Kaposi's sarcoma, AIDS, was finally over.

I watched as his loving sisters, Linda, JoAnne, Pat and Grace tried to give him the encouragement to go on, hoping like I, that his heaving chest would stop soon. Charlie had developed pneumonia. His breathing was the most difficult I had ever seen, and this had been going on for three days.

I also watched as I saw another friend in the same room with me. He was an AIDS patient also and had only been diagnosed about two weeks ago. I kept wondering what he must be going through inside, knowing what this hideous disease was doing to his brother.

Over the years Charlie Stanley never said no to me with my involvement with the Alternative Relations Center and the Phoenix Levi Leather Club, as well as several other community organizations. He usually never waited to be asked but donated his money, his time, his bar, his concern, to the community.

Charlie Stanley is gone now. His spirit will go on, our friendship is still there. The things he stood for will go on. Charlie was very involved with the AIDS effort here. Giving time to newspapers or anyone wanting information from an AIDS victim, he helped right up to the end. Charlie had to resign his position on the Arizona AIDS FUND TRUST BOARD a couple of months ago because of his declining health, but we kept in touch.

He was very aware of the efforts here, not wanting another person to have to go through this thing he was going through.

To Charlie's family I would like to express my sincere sympathy. I promise you, Charlies death made a lasting impression on my life and I will do whatever I can to help in the fight of this disease.

On Wednesday, September 28th from 9pm to 1am, Trax will be having a benefit for another brother of mine, Tony Hipsher.

There will be a \$10.00 cover charge, all of this going to Mr. Hipsher. Coors and Coors Lite bottled beer will be 50¢ from 9pm to 1am.

If you believe what I believe, if this is the community I think it is, Trax will be bursting with his friends, brothers and sisters, all trying to give a helping hand. Tony was diagnosed in July of this year and he has had already two hospitalizations. This creative artist has given so much to the community in the form of his creative glass work from Emerald City Stained Glass to his inspiration in developing the Desert Sky Singers.

Another brother has been stricken and needs our help. Who kows how many more there will be. Tony needs our

help now!! I'll be there and I hope I see every face I know there also.

Please, members of the Arizona gay community, let's come together, forget our petty squabbings and work together and help defeat this common enemy, AIDS.

Goodbye Charlie, I love you. You have been a true brother to me. Tony and Scott, whatever you need, you let us know.

To the Arizona community, Please, I urge you again to come to Trax on Wednesday September 28th, 1983 and show your support for these people with AIDS.

Dear Editor:
You will recall that a few months ago, I wrote you about an assault and robbery which took place last February 17 in which I was the victim. Much later that day, the Pima County Sheriff's Department arrested Larry J. Daly (born 3/7/59) and they filed numerous criminal charges against him including attempted murder and armed robbery.

Last month, Daly signed a plea bargain agreement in which he entered guilty pleas to the armed robbery charge and to two other charges. These other charges included an attempted armed robbery of the Congress Hotel on February 14 and rioting in the county jail on March 14.

Last Wednesday, September 7, Superior Court Judge, Robert Hooker, sentenced Daly to prison terms for each conviction, all terms to run concurrently. The longest term was 24 years for what he did to me.

It turns out that Daly has a lengthy criminal record with Gays figuring prominently among his victims. On October 30, 1981, Daly was convicted in connection with the beating and robbery of another gay Tucsonan. He was victimized outside a popular university area Gay bar on June 14, 1981. Daly had also been convicted of other crimes in the vicinity of Detroit, Michigan.

During the times when he was not incarcerated, Daley was regularly seen in the downtown area of Tucson, particularly in the vicinity of the now abandoned MacArthur Hotel and the Fun Tym Bookstore. With Daly no longer on the loose, I think that the Gay population of Tucson is a bit safer, but we should all be aware that there are many other Daly-types still in circulation. One must be extremely careful about whom one picks up. Violent "tricks" are just as dangerous as any disease.
