

**U.S. TOPS BEER PRODUCTS**

TOKYO — (AP) — The United States brewed more than twice as much beer as any other country last year - more than 5 billion gallons, or a quarter of global beer production, a survey said. Kirin Brewery Co. Ltd., of Japan said the United States led the list of beer producing countries with 5.29 billion gallons.

West Germany was second with 2.46 billion gallons and the Soviet Union third, with 1.76 billion gallons. Britain came in fourth with 1.55 billion gallons and Japan was fifth with 1.24 billion gallons, a spokesperson for Kirin, a leading Japanese brewer, said. Production was up 9.9 percent in Asia, 8 percent in Africa, 0.8 percent in Europe and 0.2 percent in North America.

**WHO ARE THEY, AND WHY ARE THEY SAYING ALL THOSE AWFUL THINGS ABOUT US?**

*What is Vulgar?*

Joseph Epstein, pundit and professor, going under the name "Aristides", has delivered unto us a new treatise - "What is Vulgar?" - in a recent issue of the quarterly "American Scholar" magazine. Epstein castigates publicity, the Oscars, Barbara Walters and Lauren Bacall as examples of modern vulgarity.

Epstein is notorious for his article "Homo/Hetro?" published in the September 1970 issue of "Harper's" magazine, in which he claimed that "private acceptance of homosexuality... is not to be found even among the most liberal minded, sophisticated and liberated. If I had the power to do so, I would wish homosexuality off the face of the earth. I would do so because I think that it brings infinitely more pain than pleasure to those who are forced to live with it; because I think there is no resolution for this pain in our lifetime...and because...I find myself completely incapable of coming to terms with it."

The Epstein article provoked an impassioned rebuttal and coming-out in the New York Times Magazine by Merle Miller and a sit-in by Gay activists in the Harper's offices. In his latest diatribe, Epstein contends that at the heart of modern vulgarity are exhibitionism, pretentiousness, self-congratulations, self-importance, and hypocrisy.

### LUMBERJACK PIE

3 lbs. pork (or chicken)  
 3lbs. ground beef  
 5 large onions, chopped  
 1/8 teaspoon Thyme  
 1/8 teaspoon Oregano  
 5 peppercorns  
 Salt (to taste)  
 1 tablespoon Cinnamon  
 3 cups mashed potatoes  
 Rich pie pastry

Place pork (or chicken) in deep pot. Add one chopped onion, cover with water and cook two hours. Add thyme, oregano, peppercorns and salt to taste. Continue cooking four hours or until the meat is tender enough to fall from the bones. Cool, remove fat from meat; grind lean meat...adding back a little of the fat. Run four onions through the grinder and mix well with the meat. Add cinnamon. Mix in mashed potatoes (about 2 1/2 cups) to give a consistency not dry, not mushy, just in between. A little brandy couldn't hurt here. Season with salt to taste. Yield: filling for four double crust 9 inch pies. Bake the pies at 375F. for one hour. Pickles and celery are the crunchy accompaniments. If served for an early evening meal as the meat dish, serve with a vegetable of your choice. Butch it up boys! This recipe was first printed in the Sunday Supplement of THE TIMES back in 1940, in the christmas issue.


