



## THIRD NABC CONVENTION NEARS

LOS ANGELES - The National Association of Business Councils (NABC) has reported additional details in its 1983 convention in Los Angeles. Hundreds of Gay and Lesbian professionals, business owners and company representatives will be attending NABC's third annual gathering from November 3 to November 6.

The centerpiece of the four day schedule is the banquet on Saturday, Nov. 5. Hank Koehn, a fascinating speaker, (as well as the Vice-President of Futures Research for Security Pacific Bank), will deliver the keynote address. Mr. Koehn will be followed by a program of entertainment.

Culminating the evening will be NABC's awards presentation. Debbie Reynolds will receive the Humanitarian Award for her ongoing efforts to raise funds for AIDS research. The Business Award will be accepted by the Miller Brewer Company. The recipient of the Political Award will be announced shortly.

The NABC is a non-profit, tax-exempt organization representing the interests of twenty-nine constituent business and professional councils. Membership is comprised of thousands of businesses, professional Gay men and Lesbians, and friends and supporters from the non-gay community. The convention is being hosted by the Los Angeles Business and Professional Association (BAPA). Members and non-members are equally welcome. ## FLY THE FRIENDLY SKIES

SAN FRANCISCO - Air New Zealand has launched a campaign to attract Gay passengers. A spokesperson for the airline's marketing office in San Francisco said that the company is "looking at a series of programs that would relate to the Gay community."

The spokesperson's reasoning: "Well, it is a very affluent portion of our San Francisco community, and Sydney, Australia has a very strong Gay community, and San Francisco and Sydney are sister cities, and it just seems like an ideal opportunity." The spokesperson also said that his company's aggressiveness regarding the Gay community has caused its chief competitors, Quants and Continental, to rethink their positions about Gay passengers. ## GARAGE SALE MARKS CLOSING OF BATHS

SAN FRANCISCO - (GCN) - A garage sale marked the closing of a local bathhouse called the Hothouse, "a leatherman's landmark," according to Equal Times. About 400 buyers looked over a variety of whips, chains, harnesses and other exotic paraphernalia during the recent close-out garage sale. The HOthouse once served as many as 400 customers a day in a massive four-story complex. However the fear of contracting AIDS caused a 50 percent drop in business, according to owner Louis Gaspar.

"I don't think that it's where you have sex that causes AIDS, but what you do," said Gaspar. "But still, I came to see this as part of the problem. Considering the moral and ethical questions involved I just couldn't stay open when I felt I might be somehow responsible for people getting it."

## \$2 MILLION FOR '84 AGAINST GAYS

WASHINGTON DC - Using Gay rights as a major focus of their campaign, Christian Voice, and anti-gay lobby, will spend \$2 million next year to help re-elect Ronald Reagan, Gay media writer Larry Bush reported. The effort will quadruple the \$500,000 campaign against Jimmy Carter, labeled as pro-gay and anti-family in 1980. "We expect to, once again, make our TV and radio spots on the homosexual rights issue a major part of our campaign in 1984," said lobbyist Gary Jarmin. (Out)

## ANITA HAWKING HOOP SKIRTS

SELMA, AL - For those who wonder whatever happened to Anita Bryant, the Chicago Tribune reports that after divorcing Bob Green (and publicly acknowledging that he had used her for his own publicity purposes in encouraging her to pursue the anti-gay crusade), Bryant moved to this Southern city (famous as the site of landmark civil rights showdown in the 1960's).

Bryant was linked romantically for some time with Selma "tycoon" Larry Stripin, but he married someone else. The woman who led the "Save our Children" (from homosexuality) campaign is now a single mother of four children and a partner in a local dress shop called the Wardrobe.

## NGRA PRESENTS ORAL ARGUMENT IN MILITARY CASE

SAN FRANCISCO - The United States Court of Appeals in Washington, DC will hear oral arguments in a case involving the rights of Lesbians and Gay men to serve in the military. National Gay Rights Advocates (NGRA), the San Francisco-based public interest law firm, is making a constitutional challenge to the navy's exclusionary policy.

The military requires that all homosexuals be discharged solely on the basis of their sexual orientation, without regard to an individual's fitness to serve. Leonard Gragg, NGRA Legal Director, said, "The navy's mandatory discharge policy violates the constitutionally protected rights of privacy, due process and equal protection of the laws."

NGRA Executive Director, Jean O'Leary, said, "The only legitimate qualification for serving in the military is the ability to do the job. The navy's policy is an irrational discrimination against Lesbians and Gay men." NGRA filed the lawsuit in the District of Columbia Circuit because, by reputation, it is the most liberal. And, a victory in Washington would be of benefit to all service members, regardless of where they are stationed.

## CAREER CHANGE WORKSHOPS AT U of A

TUCSON - Are you a teacher or secretary who is contemplating a career change? The Division of Continuing Education at the University of Arizona is offering two workshops, one for the teachers and one for secretaries, each of which will consist of two sessions. Among the topics to be covered are Identifying your Marketable Skills, Targeting your Career Interests and Reworking your Resume.

The Career Change for Teachers two session workshop is to be held on Tuesday, Oct. 25 and Thursday, Oct. 27, from 6:30 to 9:00PM.

## LEATHER THEFT CAUSE FOR DISCRIMINATION

PITTSBURGH, PA - The following appeared in a recent issue of the University of Pittsburgh's "Pitt News" at the end of a short question and answer feature which otherwise seemed legitimate:

Q. Can any landowner or landlord discriminate against gays?

A. In most cases, no. However, the higher courts in some western or highly agricultural states have recently upheld legislation allowing ranch owners to refuse to allow Gays to live or work near the property, citing the incidence of leather theft as justification. (Out)

## TELL THEM ANYTHING, BUT DON'T BE SEXIST

SAN FRANCISCO - Here's a new list of sexist words to banish: Test, Testify, Testimony and Testament.

According to the syndicated trivologist, L.M. Boyd, all these words derive from the Latin "testis", referring to those male parts. In ancient Rome, apparently, when a man swore an oath, he would consecrate it by reaching under the second man's toga and firmly grasp the man's parts.

## NATION'S POOR TAKE CUTBACKS ON THE NOSE

WASHINGTON DC - The Congressional Budget Office reported that cutbacks in federal spending have hurt poor families the most. Forty percent of the cuts fell on families with incomes of less than \$10,000.00 per year. In the last two years, the following proportions of funds have been cut from federal budgets for human services: 28% from children's nutrition programs; 13% from welfare and food stamps; 17% for financial aid to poor students; 27% for guaranteed student loans; and 60% for employment and training programs.

Households with yearly incomes under \$10,000.00 will lose \$430.00 per family, compared with \$250.00 per family for those making over \$10,000.00. Approximately 23% of all families in the country are in the under \$10,000.00 per year income bracket.

I beg for gay literature from anywhere I can get it. I am twenty four years old as of Sept. 17. I was touched by your editorial in your Sept. 30th edition.

So many gays are caught up in their own lives and constantly gripe about things that they feel should be changed in regard to the gay society, but don't want to get off of their buns and do anything about it. And are the first to cut down and make fun of those that are getting together and giving their full support to our cause! I would like to take this time, if I may, to make a few comments. We are a minority that society in general looks for things to cut us down. Instead of banning together as a whole and attacking matters that concern us as gays, "some" of us sit back and refuse to involve ourselves for something positive but are more than happy to be rude or make mockery of those who try to go all out for the cause.

A lot of you should realize that those who own gay businesses go through hell trying to keep it going and get enough problems from straights, without getting it from their own people. I am in prison over drugs and believe me it is no picnic. It's a very lonely life. I am presently locked up in solitary because of my sexual preference. People in prison including the administration mock gay people.

The straight guys think we are here for their sexual pleasure. They think we are weak people. They think we only think about sex. They don't even think we have feelings. I can definitely identify with Alice Cooper's song "Welcome to my Nightmare." I hope and pray that I will walk out of here alive and in one piece. I don't think we realize how easy it is for the system to put us away.

I see people getting thrown in prison for driving while drunk. Never in trouble in their life. Please...If you know of our people getting into a car drunk, Stop them! Lend a helping hand. Those of us who see drugs as fun and games, believe me, the system has the last laugh!

We don't choose to be gay. Society has yet to realize we can't be changed. Therefore we suffer because of it. Please, people it is time we stopped the party long enough to reach out and do something for our society. This is a turning point for our society and should be handled with extreme care and caution.

I would also like to stress to the parents of gays, the fact that if you turn on your child because of his or her preference, unfortunately drugs have a tendency to shield the hurt on a temporary basis and drain us of everything including our last breath. Please, brother and sisters, stick together, help each other. Don't work against each other. Behind these steel bars is one of you and believe me, I love each and every one of you. Don't give up, the battle has only begun. If you as my brothers and sisters give up then I will give up my fight for mere survival. Recently my lover died of a heart attack at the age of 51. He died fighting for me because he believed in me. I does get lonely and depressing in here and if any of you would like to drop me a line please feel free. I will answer as many as my postal budget will allow. I am in solitary confinement, and due to be transferred, but my mail will be forwarded. Brothers and sisters my heart and prayers are with you. Here is a salute to all of you at "ATTITUDE" for doing such a fine job of bringing gay news to us all. Thank you.



### From The Gay Rights National Lobby: Some Helpful Hints for Writing to Congress

- **KEEP YOUR LETTER BRIEF** — a page or two is probably an ideal length.
- **HANDWRITTEN LETTERS ARE PERFECTLY ACCEPTABLE** — so long as they are legible! You do not have to type your letter.
- **GO DIRECTLY TO YOUR POINT** — Let the Senator or Congressperson know what you would like him or her to do. Explain why. Relate the issue to your congressional district or state. When you talk about that legislator's constituents, you have his or her undivided attention!
- **ASK FOR THEIR POSITION** — Be sure to ask the legislator to tell you his/her position on the issue: "Will you co-sponsor this legislation?" "Will you support this bill?" "Will you oppose the amendment?"
- **DEMONSTRATE YOUR KNOWLEDGE OF HIS/HER PAST ACTIONS** — For instance: "I know and appreciate the fact that you opposed the anti-gay amendment to Legal Services. I believe that support for (co-sponsorship of) the civil rights bill would be a consistent extension of that stand for non-discrimination."
- **AVOID ASSOCIATING YOURSELF WITH A GROUP** — Generally it is best to avoid mentioning your membership in, or association with, a citizen lobby. Legislators care more about your individual views.

- **USE YOUR OWN WORDS** — The Gay Rights National Lobby has already used, and will probably again use, pre-printed postcard campaigns at critical times. We do so partially because our community and those who share our commitment to social justice have shown no particular willingness to generate massive personal letter campaigns, YET. But, admittedly, pre-printed postcards and form letters do not have the same impact as a well-worded personal letter. Even when the lobby puts out pre-printed materials in the future, it has far more impact if you take the essential message and put it in your own words.
- **HOW TO WRITE** — Below are the addresses to write:
  - Senator (your Senator's name)  
U.S. Senate  
Washington, DC 20510
  - Congressperson (your Representative's name)  
House of Representatives  
Washington, DC 20515
- **FOLLOW UP ANY ANSWER** — When the legislator writes back, follow up with a letter to again drive home your point. If she/he gave a vague or unclear response or no response to your question, use the second letter to firmly, but *politely*, ask again.
- **WHOM TO WRITE** — You should not hesitate to write your legislators - even in you think they are hostile to your views. GRNL may also, from time to time, ask you to write members of the key committees and subcommittees. It is a good idea, in these cases, to send a copy of your letter to your own Senators or Congresspersons.

### IN TOUCH CELEBRATES TENTH ANNIVERSARY


