

TUCSON LESBIAN AND GAY PRIDE COMMITTEE MEETS

TUCSON - The Tucson Lesbian and Gay Pride Committee announced that its next general membership meeting will be on Monday, November 28. Business to be discussed: Issues of Publicity, Future Fundraisers and social activities. A special invitation to all women and men in the community to get involved in their committee. The meeting will be held upstairs at The Fintline at 6:30PM.

At the meeting held last Monday, Nov. 14, it was discussed that all was in readiness for the AIDS Health Forum which was held on Wednesday, Nov. 16. Ideas for future activities to be sponsored by the Committee were brought up. Suggestions were made to organize a Lesbian/Gay Skate Night; a Hayride and a Horseback Riding Party. Persons were appointed to contact businesses about the activities and to report back at the next General Meeting in December.

Final amendments were made and passed on the remaining sections of the by-laws of the Tucson Lesbian and Gay Pride Committee. A move was then made and seconded to pass the by-laws as amended. A vote was taken and the by-laws were accepted unanimously by those members present.

AFL-CIO ENDORSES GAY CIVIL RIGHTS LEGISLATION

WASHINGTON DC - The Gay Rights National Lobby announced that the AFL-CIO has taken an official position supporting the "civil rights of all persons without regard to sexual orientation." Delegates meeting at the 15th Biennial Constitution Convention in Hollywood, Florida, overwhelmingly endorsed a resolution urging passage of Lesbian and Gay civil rights legislation at the local, state and federal levels. The AFL-CIO represents 14 million union members.

MEN'S CHORUS PREPARES CHRISTMAS TOUR DE FORCE

PHOENIX - In the two years since its formation, Desert Sky Singers, the Phoenix Community Men's Chorus, has performed on twenty-five different occasions, including seven major concerts. In the past several months, the chorus has appeared at Phoenix Civic Plaza's "Summer Sunday", Pioneer Park in Mesa, "Oaroberfest" at South Mountain, and concluding the fall season an appearance at the Arizona State Fair.

In addition to the busy fall schedule, the chorus has been putting in long rehearsal hours for its upcoming Christmas concert, entitled "Sounds of the Season," performances will be Saturday, December 11 at 3:00PM at Brophy Chapel, 4701 North Central Avenue. Tickets are on sale at R. Hegyi, Diamonds and Civic Plaza Box Office, and from chorus members.

NGRA FILES BRIEF IN TEXAS SODOMY APPEAL

SAN FRANCISCO - National Gay Rights Advocates (NGRA), the San Francisco based public interest law firm, is urging that AIDS not be accepted as a rationale for justifying a sodomy statute. In 1982, a U.S. District Court, in a landmark ruling, struck down the Texas sodomy statute as being unconstitutional. The case is now on appeal to the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Fifth Circuit in New Orleans, where the Amarillo, Texas District Attorney is arguing that the sodomy statute is necessary to control AIDS.

Neither the D.A. nor the Attorney General brought up the AIDS argument at the trial level. Leonard Graff, NGRA Legal Director said, "It is simply improper to bring up a new issue for the first time at the appellate level. And even if they could, it is a weak argument because nobody had even heard of AIDS at the time the Texas Legislature enacted the sodomy statute."

Jean O'Leary, Executive Director of NGRA, said, "The D.A. is trying to exploit the public hysteria and to use irrational fear in an emotional attempt to persuade the Court. We expect the Court to disregard this shallow tactic." O'Leary also noted that both sodomy repeal and the prevention of AIDS discrimination are both priority issues for NGRA.

NATIONAL THIRD WORLD/PEOPLE OF COLOR CONFERENCE POSTPONED

SAN FRANCISCO - Having made a serious commitment to have a significant visible presence and involvement of Native Americans, Asians and Latinos, the National Third World/People of Color Conference has been postponed until June 21 through 22, 1984 - Lesbian/Gay Pride Week.

Planning Committee members felt that as the conference was evolving, too much of a Black focus was emerging and more time was needed to devote to outreach in communities and organizations of Asians, Native Americans and Latinos. All other developments for the national Third World/People of Color Conference are firm.

Tax deductible donations can be earmarked for the Conference by making such donations payable to "American Friends Service Committee." Pre-registrations is \$15 and should be made payable to "TW/PC Conference." Donations and pre-registrations should be sent to 584 Castro St., Suite 227, San Francisco, Ca. 94114.

NAVY CAPTAIN TO FACE COURT—MARTIAL ON SODOMY CHARGES

NORFOLK, VA (GON) - A Navy Captain, accused of having an affair with a male sailor on his ship, will be court-martialed here later this year, according to the Washington Post.

Cmdr. Gerald M. Vandermier, 42, had been relieved as skipper of the USS Edward McDonnell last June while the Navy investigated charges of homosexual activity with a 21-year old chief petty officer during a cruise last spring in the Mediterranean.

A Vice-admiral recently ordered that Vandermier be tried on three counts of sodomy. Vandermier is a decorated veteran of the Vietnam War. He is married and denies that he is Gay.

LESBIAN MOMS SHATTERS STEREOTYPES

NEW YORK, NY - Lesbian mothers bring up their kids the same way as non-Gay mothers do. That's the conclusion of two researchers who say that their studies of Gay and non-Gay single mothers could shatter many stereotypes about Lesbian life. According to medical anthropologist Ellen Lewin and psychiatrist Martha Kirkpatrick, Gay women follow "highly traditional" methods of child rearing, and they have "sons who take out the garbage and daughters who wash the dishes."

They are eager to provide their kids with male role models, and most expect the father to keep up parental involvement. Lewin and Kirkpatrick say the kids appear to show no more gender-related problems or sex role confusion than siblings raised by non-Gays. And, says Kirkpatrick, Lesbian mothers are "not as angry at men as most of the straight mothers."

RAY-GUN'S PRAYER AMENDMENT

Ronald Ray-Gun's proposed "Prayer Amendment" (SJR 73) to the Constitution of the United States stands dangerously close to passage. There is no possible need for a constitutional amendment to have "voluntary" prayer in America's tax-supported public schools. Any child who wishes can pray now in public school, even we atheists support that right. However, we do not support the concept of group prayer. The Reagan amendment would invalidate the Supreme Court rulings in this regard.

The First Amendment to the Constitution and the "wall of separation" between church and state are at stake. If this should become law the stranglehold of christianity and the reaching of those cults will have a profound effect in the public school system.

Write or call your Senator and Representative NOW. This is soon to be acted upon. For those not familiar with the amendment, it reads as follows:

"Nothing in this constitution shall be construed to prohibit individual or group prayer in public schools or other public institutions. No person shall be required by the United States or by any State to participate in prayer. Neither the United States or any State shall compose the words of any prayer to be said in the public schools."

This is clearly in violation of the First Amendment to the Constitution. As you have recently witnessed through Reagan's invasion of a foreign land, the U.S. Constitution means very little to him. Write now, oppose SJR 73!

I must thank Joe, Bobby, and Jessie at the 307, as they certainly know how to help a rather mature person, like me, celebrate a birthday.


