




### GPA WESTERN REGIONAL CONFERENCE NOW HISTORY

PHOENIX - The Western Regional Conference for members and guests of the Gay Press Association was held last Friday, Saturday and Sunday. Some thirty persons representing eight Gay publications in the western United States were in attendance. Seminars, workshops and meetings were the order of the day for the members of GPA. Most of the activity centered in the Hyatt Regency Hotel, which was conference headquarters, but there was time arranged for getting out into the Phoenix community to visit other Gay establishments.

One of the more popular meeting places was the Hospitality Suite which was hosted by members of the Arizona Gay Barowners Association (AGBA). The suite was open in between workshops and after the days work for those who wished to partake of the relaxing environment. Optional events included the Janus Theatre Company's current presentation of "Thanksgiving," and The Desert Sky Singers' Christmas Concert. A dinner, hosted by Marianne Ferrari, publisher of the Gay guides, "Places of Interest" and "Places of Interest to Women."

Publications represented at the conference included Gayzette (San Diego), Nexus (San Diego), Washington Cascade Voice (Seattle), Common Bond (Albuquerque), Buck Rogers Happenings (Los Angeles), Frontiers (Los Angeles), Attitude (Tucson), and host for the Western Regional Conference, the staff of the Phoenix-based Western Express.

Representing the Gay Press Association was its Executive Director Mike Rutherford from New York. Congratulations to all who made this regional conference a most enjoyable and informative one. The National Convention of the Gay Press Association will be held in Los Angeles over Memorial Day 1984.

Among other work accomplished by the Conference, the group passed three resolutions: 1. Urging the Gay Press Association (members and Board of Directors) adopt a strong position of support for the Equal Rights Amendment (ERA). 2. A resolution concerning the homophobic remarks of Hawley Atkinson, Chairman of the Board of Supervisors of Maricopa County, and requesting that the Board of Directors of the Gay Press Association issue a public statement of censure and to take whatever avenues of recourse to bring to the attention of the national media "our concern for the blatant and serious disregard of the civil rights of our community by an elected official." 3. The Conference issued a resolution expressing its gratitude to the Arizona Barowners Association, its members and those who donated time, services and material, and to commend AGBA "for its work on behalf of the Gay communities of Arizona toward the development of a better image for all Gay communities."

### ANNUAL HAYRIDE TO WINTERHAVEN DEC. 20.

TUCSON — The annual Christmas Hayride sponsored by the Joshua Tree/Back Packer has been scheduled for next Tuesday, December 20. This annual affair picks up persons interested in taking the ride at each of the Tucson Gay bars and transports them to Winterhaven, a suburb located in central Tucson, in which all the community of Winterhaven presents one of the most lavish and beautiful Christmas decorations of their homes, trees, and street.

The hayride truck will leave from the Joshua Tree parking lot at 7:00PM and head for the Graduate, then on to the Fineline and then to Rita's Rendezvous. From Rita's, the group will then tour Winterhaven, then return to Joshua Tree for Hot Buttered Rum and will return all participants to the bars where they were originally picked up. Hawley Atkinson's remarks about Gays, "Why don't you bring in the homosexuals and lesbians from San Francisco and let's experiment on them," has caused a certain amount of reaction all the way from local Gays to the Republic and Gazette to Benson's cartoons and from far away as San Francisco itself.

Locally, reports are that letters in large quantities (?) are going to the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors calling for Atkinson's removal or resignation. The call for this action, while well-intentioned, is a useless endeavor, since Atkinson IS the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors, and is not likely to remove himself!

When I spoke to Atkinson's secretary, she assured me with a belly-laugh that he was "reading all his fan mail" and was having a good chuckle at our stupidity. She further stated that he had gained 30,000 new votes with his outrageous statement. Let us hope for all our sakes that this is not the case.

We agree that a letter writing campaign is an excellent way to handle this, and we urge everyone to write a letter. Just as with Anita Bryant, he will turn out to be one of our "better" enemies, for we can most assuredly use him as an example of outrageous bigotry and further proof of the need for an extension of the Phoenix civil rights provisions to include homosex and lesbian people. If not for Atkinson and his ilk we would not be fighting in the political arena.

## COUNCIL RACE OUTCOME... GOOD AND BAD

Election night, December 13, 8:30 p.m., Election Central in downtown Phoenix. The place is a beehive, buzzing with the excitement and anxiety of the evening. Votes are tallying up as the green figures appear, district by district; we're all on the edges of our seats. Duane Pell is smiling, and for good reason; Rosie Gutierrez is smiling too, but for a different reason.

The early tally looked like this:

District 1: Parks 2446, Zook 2147, half the precincts counted.

District 2: Pell 1660, White 1056, 1/3 of the precincts counted.

District 3: Starr 4156, Lynch 4070, 29 of 39 precincts counted.

District 4: Gutierrez 1614, Nelson 2614, 20 of 35 precincts counted.

District 5: Johnson 2875, Adams 3257, half the precincts counted.

District 6: Konick 4777, Gardiner 3032, 28 of 47 precincts counted.

District 7: Wilcox 1922, George 1126, 19 of 30 precincts counted.

At 8:45, Rosie is conceding to John Nelson. What a shame, trading a minority vote for a "strong Christian", more about that later. Barry Starr is sweating, and Terry Goddard is making mental notes. Later Terry said he was "very pleased" at the outcome, and called the new Council "an independent group I have a lot of respect for". A preliminary meeting between the new Council and Mayor-Elect Goddard is scheduled for Saturday. Terry is wasting no time.

Later, when nearly all the votes were tallied, Duane Pell had a 1600 vote lead over Jim White, a resounding victory for Duane, a lesson too late for the learning for White. Konick emerged the winner over ex-cop, Right-winger Jim Gardiner with a healthy 3-2 margin. Mary Rose Wilcox came out on top over G.G. George as expected. And Dr. Parks clearly defeated Fred Zook. But Barry Starr was still sweating. At one point he held a mere 10 vote lead, and of course Anne Lynch has demanded a recount, though in the last hours Starr held a 47 vote lead.

Now that the dust has settled we find we have garnered five seats on the Council in our favor in this election (Calvin Goode in District 8 was elected in November). But in the two lost districts, some of the blame for the defeats can be safely aimed at our own community.

In the Primary Election we supported Gary Klahr in District 4. Gary wrote the new ordinance we hope to have introduced in the new Council. He is a long-time, unflinching friend of the gay community, and has fought many a battle for us all. Gary did not receive the endorsement of Arizona Lesbian and Gay Task Force, nor did he receive the support of The Western Express. Why we still do not know. Gary lost in the Primary. Had he been the able to run in this election against John Nelson the outcome would have been quite different, since Gary is an outspoken advocate of westside residents and issues. Such a campaign would have been far more vocal than was the Gutierrez-Nelson fight. But there was no opportunity for Gary to run. Rosie Gutierrez, on the other hand, had a severe problem in District 4. He was viewed there as a carpetbagger, and his opponent made a strong point of this. Gutierrez proved to be a weak candidate, and Nelson may prove to be a real problem for us on the new Council. These foolish indiscretions have a way of coming back to haunt us. In District 4 we were divided and conquered, just as we had warned.

The other losing district was District 5 where Maeve Johnson ran against Howard Adams. Adams emerged the victor, though not by a very large margin. Here again, Maeve Johnson was our chosen candidate, but Kirk Baxter of ALGIF and The Western Express did not support her. How many of those winning votes cast for Howard Adams came from the Gay constituency in District 5? We will never know, but here again, divide and conquer was the rule of the day, and we are all the losers for it.

In two districts, we can all pat ourselves on the back, for our votes were obviously the deciding votes for the winning candidates. There is absolutely no doubt that Barry Starr's slim margin of victory was the result of Gay voters in District 3. The same can be said for Dr. Parks' victory in District 1, which is a conservative (Republican) area of the city, where a liberal has just been elected by a small margin. Our effect on the outcome in these two districts will not be overlooked.

A few words of thanks are in order at this point. We wish especially to thank all of the Gay voters who saw the importance of the new Council election and made a special effort to get out and vote. You did it. In addition, CCR extends thanks to The Attitude for their weekly and continuing support and all the space provided. They have saved us countless hundreds of dollars in printing costs and time. Thanks also goes to all the bars who allowed us to spread the word in their establishments, and still more thanks to the various individuals who helped us distribute our voter information, and to Bob Hegyi for conspicuously displaying our voter information guide in his shop, which is located in District 5, where much help was needed. It is people like these who sense the importance of such elections, knowing that without the right people on the City Council, Phoenix could continue to have Hancesque government as usual, with no hope of anything like the new ordinance being passed. The entire community owes all of them a great debt of thanks.

But the work has not concluded with this election. It has only begun, and as the time nears for the new Council to take office, and for the new ordinance to be introduced, we shall persevere, and we will need your continued support again.







## "YENTL"



Once upon a time there lived a little Jewish girl with some singing talents who wanted to make it big. She managed to overcome the prejudices of sex and religion. She made it big. She came across a little story that she could really relate to. She wanted to make a movie of it. So she did.

Yentl is a smart young Jewish girl who lives alone with her father. The place is Europe and the time is the early 1900's. She should be happy shopping for carp and baking apples, but she wants to study her religion. Girls however are not allowed to do this, so she steps papa who loves her enough to indulge her by tutoring her at home. (But close the curtains! God will understand but I'm not so sure about the neighbors). Papa dies, so Yentl cuts off her hair, dresses like a boy and enrolls in an all male school. There she is befriended by her study partner, Avignon (Mandy Patinkin). Yentl of course falls in love with him but Avignon is in love with another - Hodass. They want to marry but a bad thing in his family past prevents this from happening. Avignon convinces his good buddy, Yentl, to take his place. He/she does. He still loves Hodass. Yentl loves him. Yentl is married to Hodass. Hodass falls in love with Yentl. And so it goes!

Role reversal seems to be the subject to tackle in films. Given the fact that the rights for this story were purchased some ten years ago, Barbra Streisand got the jump on everyone short of Billy Wilder. What she appears to overlook is the inherent comedy in this kind of story. This is a work of the heart. It is drama. It is social, religious and

personal commentary. Yeah, right. Every other scene is ripe with humor. Poor nervous Yentl (as a boy) having to share a bed with a male classmate. Or better yet, having to witness all the guys skinny dipping. Everyone does his or her best to mumble and down play any sense of humor in this story. This is drama, remember?

This is not a musical just because Ms. Streisand is in it. The ads in the newspaper state this is "A Film With Music". Not a musical. Yeah, right. She does a lot of singing, especially within the first five minutes. The music is introduced at times as an inner monologue of what her character is thinking. Surrounded by people talking, here is this voice, singing. Sometimes she moves her mouth to the words, sometimes not. Distracting.

The song score was, in part, penned by Alan and Marilyn Bergman, who last year received nominations for Best Song from two different movies. You may know the movies, but I defy you to hum a few bars of either song. Unfortunately every song in the current film suffers a similar fate, as I left the theatre without a single tune to hum.

I have always been suspicious of performers who direct produce and market themselves. How can what they are doing be objective? Ms. Streisand is first known as a singer. Then she is known as a wise-cracking Fanny Brice in "Funny Girl." Surely she feels more comfortable with a few songs to deal with. So this film has songs, but in almost every scene I kept waiting for and almost saw a little Fanny ready to burst forth. Oy Vay!

This is not to say that Yentl is a bad movie, but it made me think of saccharin. Sweet but not the real thing.

As a visual period piece, Yentl is very stunning. Much attention to setting and detail is apparent. The cinematography is muted and pretty. Even some of the editing and pacing is interesting. But for me the ultimate feeling was a little bit of schizophrenia. Not a drama, not a comedy. Not a musical, okay. What? Better yet, ask Barbra.


