Sometimes it is like the adage of comparing apples to oranges. Excuses excuses. Perhaps so. Yet a year's worth of celluloid is no small matter. Kind readers will hopefully understand my reluctance to duplicate the pack of thers. Maybe after the holidays, when I have recovered from the festivities and fruitcake.

This is a busy time for movie-going also. Lots of releases are made now, not to mention getting in under the deadline for Oscar consideration. Instead of going over stuff that might already be gone from local screens, some quick looks at current valley viewing. The list is in alphabetical order. Most are new releases, some are not.

"CHRISTINE"

I enjoy Stephen King's novels. I am also of the opinion that none of his writing can be totally and sincerely transferred to the screen intact. Carrie came close. This John Carpenter version of Mr. King's latest best seller is a fair translation. Haven't we all known a car we hated? How about one that hates back?

"THE BIG CHILL"

Given a justifiable opportunity people over thirty will indeed support a film at the box office. A thoughtful piece of work. And yes, those of the 'baby boom' generation can relate easily.

"GORKY PARK"

Well received and popular novel of intrigue in the Soviet Union. The film is receiving lukewarm critical support. Might be worth going to see John Hurt speaking with an accent.

"NEVER CRY WOLF"

The Disney Studios distribute a very fine production by Carroll Ballard of "Black Stallion." Neatly scripted and visually stunning.

"THE RIGHT STUFF"

The screen adaptation of Thomas Wolfe's irreverent novel about the beginnings of this country's space program is very interesting. Often is funny. A little chaotic. Sometimes difficult but admirable achievement. Be prepared for it's three hour running time.

"SCARFACE"

I haven't built up the nerve to go see this one yet. Gangster stories are not at the top of my list. Neither is Pacino, a competent actor to be sure. Director Brian DePalma lends an irresistible touch to much of his work. I will get to this one when I am in the mood for a healthy dose of violence and reality.

"SILKWOOD"

Reviewed in last weeks issue. Ms. Fonda steps aside and Meryl appears to be the one to fill the void. Meryl Streep, Kurt Russell and Cher deliver good even-handed performances. Not a high-energy or escapist experience. Real people in very sobering circumstances.

"SUDDEN IMPACT"

Dirty Harry blows more people away.

"TERMS OF ENDEARMENT"

The New York Film Critics Circle thought enough of this one to give it their best film of 1983 award. It is good. But I don't know that I would go that far. Humorous and sentimental it is worth seeing if only to catch a strong performance turned in by Shirley MacLaine, wrinkles and all.

"TO BE OR NOT TO BE"

Overall, I am not a devoted fan of Mel Brooks' films. I am circumspect where movie remakes are concerned. This is both. At least it has the semblance of a script. I wish Anne Bancroft worked more often.

"YENTI"

If you like 'B.S.' there is a very good chance that you will enjoy this flick. A harmless piece of entertainment about gender-fuck, no less. At the very least you get to see Manny Patinkin in the buff.

The hype is starting for, yes, another sequel. Much time has elapsed with this one. The coming attraction features a totally black screen accompanied by the familiar "2001" theme and the appearance of huge red numbers that fill the whole screen. That's it. Kubrick's Space Odyssey" changed the way space explorations and Buck Rogers' antics were represented. One can only hope it is good. The book is available at your public library. The title of it is "2010."

Here is wishing each and everyone a festive holiday and a good year to come. Enjoy and have fun. In the words of a television character who is no longer with us, "Be Careful Out There."
